MINUTES OF PRESBYTERY.

At Crenshaw, and within the Presbyterian church there on Tuesday September first and at two o'clock p. m. which place and late the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met and was constituted Mr A D McDonald, moderator with whom were present Messrs Spencer, Millar, E Smith, J W McLean and Rattee ministers and James Simpson, elder.

The edict for the ordination and induction of Mr Ewen McDonald was returned as duly read.

In view of Mr McDonald's recent examinations for license, Presbytery agreed to waive his trials for ordination. In absence of Mr R McLean, Mr J W McLean was appointed to address the member.

Divine service was conducted by Messrs Rattee and E Smith the latter preaching from Jude 3rd verse.

The questions of the formula being satisfactorily answered Mr Ewen McDonald was ordained to the office of the Holy Ministry by prayer and the laying on of the hands of the Presbytery and was inducted into the pastoral charge of Crenshaw, Stanley and Rustico. The moderator and Presbytery gave the newly inducted minister the right hand of fellowship after which he was suitably addressed by Mr J W McLean. Mr Spencer addressed the people on their duties and thereafter Mr McDonald was welcomed by his congregation.

Presbytery held conference with the session and managers were pleased to find that the congregation hope to be self sustaining within a year.

Mr E. Smith reported that on Friday Aug. 7th, he had moderated in a call at Clifton which came out unanimously, and in favor of Mr. John Murray, late of Shubenacadie, N. S. that it was signed by 107 communicants and 85 adherents, and was accompanied by a guarantee of \$750 and a manse.

On motion the conduct of the Moderator was sustained and the Commissioners Messrs McKay, Whitehead and Corbett heard. The call was then sustained as a regular gospel call and ordered to be sent to Mr. Murray.

The following provisional arrangements were made for his induction. Service to be held in the Church at Clifton on Tuesday Sept. 29th at 2 p. m. The Moderator to preside and induct. Mr. Ewen McDonald to preach. Mr. A. Maclean Sinclair to address the Minister, and Mr. Rattee the people.

Mr. Millar reported that the call from Tryon, Hampton and Bonshaw, in favor of Mr. A. C. McDonald was now complete, that the names of 16 communicants, and 19 adherents had been added since the last meeting of Presbytery.

Mr. J. J. McLeod, Commissioner, was heard in support of the call.

The call was then sustained as a regular Gospel call and the Clerk was instructed to cite the congregation of Tignish, Montrose and Elmville, to appear for their interests at the next meeting of Presbytery.

An elder's commission, in favor of Mr. James Ramsay, was received from the Princeton congregation and his name ordered to be placed upon the roll of Presbytery.

Presbytery then adjourned to meet at the call of the Moderator, of which public intimation was made and this seditant closed with the benediction.
