THE BEEF TRUST HARD HIT.

As a result of the recent revelations about the filthy and disreputable methods of the Chicago packing houses there has been an enormous falling off in the domestic as well as the foreign consumption of beef trust meats, especially of the canned variety, and vast quantities of these products are in stock with no market in sight.

At first the packers treated the disclosures somewhat lightly, thinking the trouble would soon blow over. Now they are face to face with facts, with cancelled orders from Britain, France and Germany, while the American people themselves are reported to have largely diminished their consumption of meats, and proportionately increased the use of fish for food. The fishermen are apparently gaining something in this way.

But the great packing houses have become alarmed. As a result all the Chicago dailies are carrying page advertisements signed by the various packers, urging the public to visit their slaughter houses and packing plants and judge for themselves as to the facts. And, of course, they indignantly deny that they are as bad as has been represented.

In the meantime their employees are at work night and day cleaning up with chemicals, and building new sanitary equipments so as to make their premises presentable. They have suffered tremendously by the world-wide free advertisement of their abominations, and are now spending money with a lavish hand to regain the public confidence. It is the best they can do but the disclosures have been so revolting and so thoroughly proven that the restoration of anything like their former relations with the mass of their customers must be the work of years.

The Montreal Witness remarks that all it can recall of the Old Guard of Sir John Macdonald are Sir Charles Tupper, Sir Adolphe Caron, Sir Mackenzie Bowell and Hon. John Costigan. The latter can hardly be called a Guardsman now, as he is supporting the Liberal leader.

It is time we were done voting railway subsidies in Canada. Railway Magnate Hill from over the border is willing to come to Canada and build thousands of miles of street road without subsidy, and yet the Canadian Parliament goes on voting millions for this purpose to be added to the tens of millions already paid out in that way. Parliament is about to revoke over nine millions which had been voted and not earned within the stipulated time. Nearly three millions of this go to Ontario, three and a half millions to Quebec and \$1,687,000 to the Maritime Provinces, mostly in Nova Scotia.

LIQUOR PROHIBITION IN ONTARIO.

While Ontario is under a license system the local option provisions of the law have been so taken advantage of by the temperance people that in a large proportion of the provincial area the sale of liquors for beverage purposes is unlawful. It is gratifying to learn that an effort is to be made to enforce the restrictive clauses of the law. Public opinion demands it and it is good politics to carry out the will of the people.

It will be seen at a glance that the situation is not unlike our own. There are in Ontario everywhere local inspectors appointed under the law to see that its provisions are enforced. These have not always attended to their duties—some did so, others did not. At the recent session provision was made for the appointment of a provincial inspector whose duty it is to "keep the keepers," in other words to see that the local inspectors do their duty and enforce the penalties of the law against those who sell in local option districts where the sale is illegal.

The Toronto World which supports the Whiney Government urges the authorities to a strict enforcement of the law, especially in the local option districts, pointing out that an imperfect law honestly administered "is better than ideally perfect statutes laxly enforced." Our Government many find a wholesome precedent in Ontario for the appointment of a provincial officer to overlook the enforcement of the Prohibitory Law throughout the Province. Prosecutor Jenkins, who has done so well in Charlottetown, is clearly indicated for the position.

King Haakon is now King of Norway, "he and nobody else." The Prince of Wales witnessed the coronation, among a number of other notables, and it may be presumed that the installation has been properly conducted. The ceremony completes the wonderful achievement to be peaceably effected, by which the people of Norway separated themselves from Sweden and selected a new King for themselves. King Haakon's power is very limited under the constitution, and there is no recognised nobility or aristocracy in Norway. He will not at home be addressed as "Sire," or "Your Majesty," after the manner of other sovereigns, but in terms equivalent to "Mr. King," which is quite republican in its plainness.

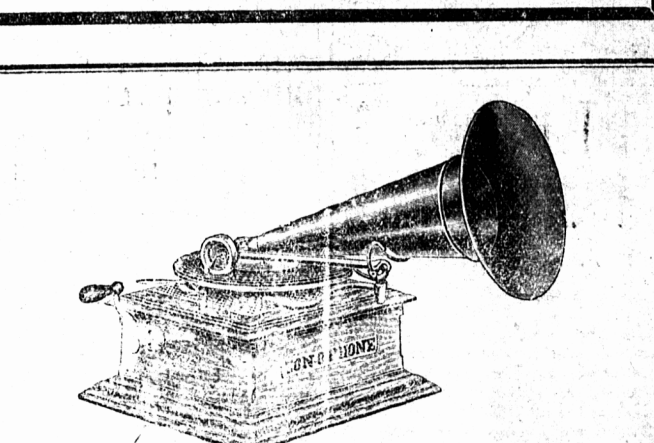
