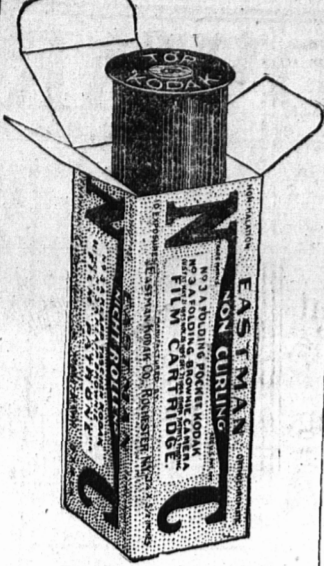

THE CAR FERRY.—A large model of the splendid new Canadian Government Railways' car ferry, the Prince Edward Island, which is now in service between the island and the mainland, is on exhibition in the window of the C. G. R. ticket office, King street, St. John, and has proved a strong attraction, as crowds of people stopped to admire the reproduction in miniature of the great vessel which will revolutionize winter travel to Prince Edward Island. The new steamer, the only one of its kind in American waters, and probably the last word in marine architecture in its class, was built in Scotland. The ferry accommodates two strings of cars, one forward and two aft. The model is of steel and is complete in every detail. —St. John Globe.

### ARMY OF FOE SPIES AT WORK IN SPAIN

LONDON, Sept. 15.—Lord Northcliffe, recording in The Times his impressions of Spain during the war, derived from a recent visit to that country, says there are 80,000 German agents in Spain, all of them constantly busy flooding the country with propaganda matter.

"The chief methods of the propaganda," he says, "seem to be daily streams of wireless despatches from Berlin and Austria discrediting the Allies; continuous activity on the part of the church and clergy; with steady work on the part of university professors and schoolmasters on behalf of the Central Powers, the chief channel being the press.

Must Come to a Decision.

PARIS, Sept. 15.—Spain must decide in favor of one or the other of the groups of belligerents in the opinion of Antonio Maura, former Premier and leader of the Conservative Party, according to news despatches from Madrid quoting an address delivered by Senor Maura.

The address was delivered at Berango near Bilbao at a meeting attended by 6,000 Mauristas. The former Premier declared, according to the despatches, that Spain could not abandon her neutrality, but that the conditions of the war made her isolation henceforth impossible. He is quoted as saying that it was moreover essential that France and England should not be hostile towards Spain.

The Madrid despatches predict that Senor Maura's speech will cause strong impression throughout the country as his prestige was never so high as at present. The majority of his followers are supposed to be pro German in their sympathies.

### GERMANS ARE NOT NOW SO CONFIDENT

WITH THE BRITISH ARMIES IN THE FIELD, Sept. 12.—It is extraordinarily difficult to know whether all the British shell fire and all the dead have yet begun to shake the confidence of the Germans in the strength of their war machine.

Some of the officers who have come in as prisoners still keep their pride. They have seen the losses inflicted on them in and behind their lines but they say "you can't beat us. We can't be beaten."

That is different from the old phrases, "we are winning," "victory is certain for Germany," and it is a long way from the acknowledgement of defeat or possible defeat. There are times when the pessimists among us are tempted to think the Germans have mysterious reserves of strength from which they can heal their wounds, and that the success gained is only local, and has not yet injured the German war machine in any vital part or struck a blow which has reached to the heart of the German people.

The cure for such pessimists is found in letters captured in the German dugouts and on German prisoners. They draw the veil aside and tell the naked truth. Through all these letters, written by men whose sons are fighting or dead, and by comrades in arms, not hiding their thoughts from each other, there is a cry against the bloodshed and misery of this war and for peace at all costs. One letter says:

"By now the town of Offenbach has 5,000 widows, and besides that there are unmarried men who have fallen from company lists, all the officers and 150 men but that is the same with every other company and every regiment on the Somme. I alas could not get the much desired wound to send me home."

There have been riots in Hamburg and other places according to letters found in the trenches, and in the spirit of civilian Germany there is rising against those who made the war and caused all this misery and who keep it lasting for political and dynastic reasons. The German Socialists at last, it seems, are beginning to lend their voice again. If one may judge from such letters as the following:

"You ask how far the peace movement has advanced. It is impossible to say anything definite, but we Socialists are now going to present to the Imperial Chancellor a great peace memorial. We want to see the German citizens who want a speedy peace without annexation, and without violence to other nations. Those who will put their names on the lists, and those lists will be collected from the whole Empire and handed to the Chancellor. God grant that their names may be put down in millions, that the Government may see that the great mass of people want an early peace."

"One may hope this accursed murdering of peoples may come to an end soon, but unfortunately, the obstinate ones have no wish for peace. They are working in all countries against it with all their power, for the international capitalists can do no better business than they are doing now, and their purses appear not full yet."

"With us the distress gets greater from day to day and already the poor people are suffering from underfeeding. We will, however, hope and act, for surely the good sense of the people may conquer in the end."
