LIVELY DISCUSSION

(Continued from Page 6)

Island has reached the point where an excellent article is offered to the trade. Apart from the information the hon. member for Prince has given the committee in connection with some dissatisfaction in regard to leases, I must say that I have never heard any person opposing leases. In fact, the fishermen look upon leasing as a regulation which will save the industry for them, and while there may be an odd one, such as has been described by the hon. member for Prince, who would like to see a cancellation of the leases, I believe the majority of the fishermen know enough about the regulations with respect to lobster fishing and as to what the regulations have done for this industry that they are quite anxious to uphold the Department of Fisheries in what it is doing for the oyster industry. In 1928 the federal government entered into a contract with the provincial government, and the policy inaugurated at that time is the policy being carried into effect today by the Department of Fisheries. If we are to give the government in power in 1928 credit for its policy and outlook, we must also give this government and its Department the same credit for carrying that policy into effect, and for promoting an industry for the fishermen of the province. I should like to impress upon the acting minister that in the county of Queens we would like a further survey of the bottoms of areas which are unproductive, with a view to affording our people an opportunity to take up leases for oyster farming.

Mr. Duff Answered

Mr. DUFF: "If the idea was to build up the industry, why did the minister lease these areas to private individuals? Why did not the government keep the thing in their own hands and not lease these areas to private individuals who will be the only ones to have the right to fish? The minister does not mean to tell me that after leasing these areas to private individuals those individuals cannot rake the beds and take off the oysters. If the minister had said that the matter was going to be left in the hands of the government in an effort to increase production, that no one was to be allowed to take oysters from the areas in question, then I could understand it; but the minister has leased these areas to his own friends who can go on—"

Mr. CANTLEY: "No."

Mr. DUFF: "Yes, I know what I am talking about. The minister has leased these areas to friends of his party in Prince Edward Island. These private individuals can go on the areas and take off all the oysters they want. Does the minister mean to tell me that these men who have leased these areas are not going to take just as many oysters from the areas, if not more, than if the public were entitled to go there and fish?"

has done it deliberately, but the fact is that he has conveyed a false impression to the committee. It should be understood quite clearly that the Department of Fisheries has not leased any of the public beds. What it has done is to lease barren bottoms where oysters were never cultivated before. An industry is being built up on bottoms which were never productive before. It should be understood that there are still public beds available to the public just as there have been since the time Adam was a little boy.

Mr. YOUNG: "He never was." Mr. MYERS: "For quite a long time. These barren bottoms are being leased to men who live adjacent thereto. The government is saying to them: Here, you go on there and plant your small oysters and then you will have the right to fish them. It is well known that the spat will drift to the public beds and that way a benefit will accrue to those who fish the beds. There will be a benefit to the fishermen at large."

Replies to Mr. McLean

"A few moments ago the hon. member for Prince (Mr. McLean) stated that he did not seek to interfere with the industry. This matter is really too big for that; it is one of the most wonderful industries we have in Prince Edward Island. Yet that does not prevent the hon. member from playing the game of politics. I know of no member in this house who is more expert in twisting and turning everything to his own political advantage."

Some hon. MEMBERS: "Order."

Mr. MYERS: "If you know him as well as I do you would say I was well within the mark. I am of the opinion that if the department had taken the opposite course and had refused to lease these barren bottoms in an effort to build up the industry, the hon. member for Prince would have kept his seat quietly to the ground until he heard the reaction in Prince county, and just as soon as he saw the direction in which the wind was blowing he would be right there with the department to try to interfere with it. I feel quite sure that when I take my seat the hon. member for Prince will tell me that I do not know anything at all about oysters. I think I remember his telling me that last year. However, I can tell him that I have a good deal about oysters, and my sympathies are all with the oyster fishermen. I hope the minister and the department will carry out the suggestion of my colleague, the hon. member for Queens (Mr. McLean). I think the department would get a square deal if they forsook Prince county altogether and moved their activities into Queens. They would receive the support to which they are justly entitled, and the minister will follow up the suggestion by my colleague that a survey be made of the areas in Queens county which we have the honour to represent. If that is done I can assure the minister that we will give our heartiest support to the project and do everything to further the activities of the department along these important lines."
