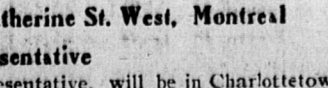
MORE MEXICAN TROUBLE.

RELLANO, Mexico, May 23—After three hours or more of fighting this forenoon between the Mexican federal and rebel armies, reports from the rebel front seemed to indicate a slight advantage over the army of Madero. The insurgents are holding firm their positions, having captured several guns, and have repulsed a federal attempt at flanking. The fighting of yesterday is declared to have resulted in a loss of 150 or more Government troops. It is claimed Orozco drove off a federal cavalry charge with great loss to the assailants.
