SPORTING NEWS

ENGLAND WINS FROM SCOTLAND

(Canadian Press) LONDON, April 4—The international football game, England vs Scotland, was played at Stamford Bridge Saturday. Eighty five thousand people saw the game. England set Scotland to play against the wind. The result was Eng. 1 Scot. 0.

LONGEST GAME IN HISTORY

(Canadian Press) PHILA. April 5—The American and National League teams today played the longest inter-league game in the history of the two major organizations. The score at the end of the 18th when the game stopped on account of the darkness was 2-2.

HARVARD FOOTBALL MEN GET POINTERS.

CAMBRIDGE, March 31—Spring football practice started in Harvard this afternoon. The pigskin chasers will be out an hour each afternoon for two weeks on Soldiers' field, and while nothing but the rudiments of the game will be gone over, it is thought that much good will be done by the short work-outs.

Leo Ikey and Paul Withington, with Capt. Bob Storer, will have charge of the practice, and Coach Percy Haughton will in all probability not be seen in the field, during the spring.

Fully 30 men are expected to be out for the spring work, although there are a number of the veterans of both varsity and freshman teams who are engaged in one of the spring major sports and will thus be unable to attend the practice. These will be excused and the general call is for the "green" men.

WORK OF THE RED SOX IN PRACTICE ENCOURAGING.

BOSTON, March 31—The Red Sox have demonstrated pretty conclusively that their batting eyes are as keen as even in the games they have played against the Pirates at the Hot Springs camp. In the records that have reached Boston, the palm is given to Henriksen and Hall, who are tied for the team's lead at the mark of 571. Speaker, Yerkes, Lewis, Gardner and Nunnemaker are all rated well above the 300, while Hooper is way below his normal average.

The youngsters released by President McAleer made no mean showing. Walsh in his one game hit for .667, and Carlstrom in four games registered a mark of .250. Janvrin was just beginning to give indications of getting into his swing when he was hurt.

In comparison with the Pirates, the world champions have the better of the showing in all departments except fielding and sacrifice hitting. The Pirates have played their regular team, while the Red Sox have played a patched-up aggregation of regulars and recruits.

The showing of the Braves against the Atlantas was discreditably only in the number of games lost—two. In batting, fielding, sacrificing, and base-running, they had all the better of the argument. In the statistics at least, Kirke, though nominally third in the list of hitters, is the real batting leader of the team. Hariden and Maranville are remarkably well advanced. Sweeney is following out his annual practice of rounding into batting form later in the season, which has also been McKechnie's habit. Maranville is displaying more life in base-running this season, a factor that is likely to win him the place at short-stop over his rival, Bues.

HARVARD TRACK ATHLETES HOLD FIRST WORKOUT.

BOSTON, April 3—All men who intend to take part in track athletics at Harvard reported to Coaches Donovan and Shrubbs at the Stadium yesterday. Before going out the athletes assembled in the track room of the locker building, where Captain Cummings explained the schedule to the men and stated what was expected of each athlete in the way of training, and outlined the work of the season in general.

Every runner will be expected to report to Coaches Shrubbs and Donovan every day, for the track season is well under way and the different meets are not far off. Besides the big intercollegiate and the Penn relays, dual meets are slated with Yale and Cornell.

The first day of real practice was a strong and the cold stiffening up the track and field men. Between 125 and 150 men came out and one of the high jumpers, Alfred D. Chandler, who holds the Brookline championship record, met with a misfortune. He jumped in fine form up to five feet eight inches, but on a higher jump pulled a tendon. It will be a great loss to the varsity team if he does not soon recover, for last year in dual meets he was a consistent jumper.

There was a large number of candidates out for the hurdles, pole vault and high jump, and a number of good men in the broad jump and hammer throw. The runners had to work against the wind and were exhausted before they finished.

Coach Shrubbs runs with the distance men and sets the pace for them. Although there have been several setbacks in the line of procuring coaches, the outlook for the coming season is encouraging.
