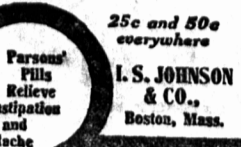

TRAIN BLOWN UP IN MEXICO; 160 ARE KILLED.

MEXICO CITY, May 4.—One hundred and sixty men, women and children, passengers on a train on the Inter-Oceanic Railroad, were killed near Ouzumba, State of Mexico, when a bridge was dynamited by Zapatista rebels while the train was passing over it.

Word of the disaster, which occurred late yesterday, was received here today in a War Department dispatch by General Mondragon.

Only ten persons escaped alive. They were so badly injured that they probably will die. The scene of the accident is fifty miles from this city.

Troops have been sent after the perpetrators of the outrage and orders were given to execute them without trial.

The train was thrown hundreds of feet into the canon.

Fifteen Zapatistas who were hidden in the hills swarmed to the scene and robbed the bodies of the dead.

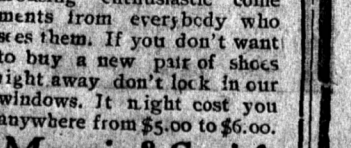
