SOLDIER RETURNS.—Corpl. Reuben N. Watts has arrived at his home at York, from Camp Hill Hospital, Halifax, where he arrived July 27th on the Hospital ship Esquibo. He enlisted Dec. 14th, 1915 with the 105th Battalion for active service at the front. He fought through the famous battles of Passchendaele, Amiens, Arras and after many hair breadth escapes was finally wounded at Canal Du-Nord and invalided to England for Du-Nord Hospital. For conspicuous bravery in the face of an enemy he was awarded the Military Medal. His brother Frank was wounded at Hill 70, and another brother George joined the 8th Siege battery and marched into Germany. Corpl. Watts is the youngest son of Fred and Mrs. Watts, York.

MISSIONARY CONFERENCE.—Rev. R. H. Stavert of Hunter River, returned on Saturday evening from Wolfville, N. S., where he had been attending the Missionary Conference held July 22-29. This conference is held under the auspices of the Missionary Education movements and is open to all denominations. There were upwards of 120 delegates present from different parts of the Maritime Provinces. The teachers were Rev. Dr. Falconer, Pine Hill College, Halifax, Rev. H. C. Priest, Toronto, Rev. D. G. Cook, Trinidad, Rev. E. C. Hennigar, Korea, Rev. J. C. Robertson, D. D. of Toronto and Rev. J. C. Robbins, Boston. A number of lady missionaries and other speakers were present and assisted at the evening meetings. At the close of the conference service held the last evening of the conference some seventeen young people volunteered for some definite form of Christian work in the home or foreign field about an equal number desired to undertake some more active Christian service in their respective spheres of labor. The conference throughout was a splendid success. The summer schools for Sunday School workers is now being held at Wolfville, July 30th August 6th. Before leaving Wolfville Mr. Stavert also attended a number of sessions of the Summer School.
