SAYS SISTER WAS STARVED.

SEATTLE, Wash., January 20—Miss Dorothea Williamson, who with her sister Claire was heir to an Australian estate of \$500,000, continued her testimony at Port Orchard today in the trial of Mrs. Linda Burfield Hazzard, a "starvation doctor." Mrs. Hazzard is accused of murder in the first degree, the charge being that she starved Claire Williamson to death.

Dorothea told of her diet while she and Claire were patients of Mrs. Hazzard in Seattle. She said she was given two meals a day, each consisting of a cup of water in which asparagus or a tomato had been boiled. Sometimes orange juice was substituted.

After two weeks of treatment Dorothea was unable to walk and experienced delirium and fainting spells. On April 22 when Dorothea was very weak, she and her sister were placed in separate ambulances, conveyed to the wharf and embarked for the Hazzard sanitarium at Olalla. Soon after their arrival Dorothea was permitted to see her sister. The latter was little more than a skeleton covered by a parchment of skin. Dorothea herself revenged for food begged Mrs. Hazzard to give her sister milk, honey, crackers or tea biscuit, but Mrs. Hazzard sternly refused.

WASHINGTON, January 22— "They have no seed to plant and no animals to do their plowing with; and this condition of affairs have gone on for so long that they have lost all desire to work; they simply want to lie down in the mud and die. These were people working on either side of the roadway, coming and going. These were all beggars and all starving. A few years ago the majority of them had been successful farmers, but now they have absolutely nothing. There was not a day that I did not pass two or three bodies of men, women and children lying on the road. When the people got tired and gave up, they simply dropped down where they were and

died; they did not even go to the raised track on the side, but dropped in the road, where they lay unburied.

"I came across the emaciated body of a young boy, five or six years old. His throat had been cut from ear to ear and a piece of paper was pinned on him which stated that his father and mother had nothing to give him to eat, and the children of the village were standing around looking at the corpse."

These were some of the observations of C. D. Jameson, a Red Cross engineer, sent to inspect the famine district of China, and to report on the possibility of food prevention in the Hwai Valley. The appalling conditions apply to nearly 3,000,000 people, and unless outside relief is instantly forthcoming, it is declared untold thousands of these must die before the scanty new crops are ripened and gathered.

Consul-General Wilder at Shanghai has seconded Mr. Jamieson's appeal in a letter directed to Miss Mabel T. Boardman, of the American Red Cross, in which he declares that bad as was the situation last year, new elements have entered into it to make it worse, and to justify another appeal to the Red Cross and through it to charitable Americans.

BAR REACHING EFFECT OF PANAMA CANAL.

VANCOUVER, Jan. 30—In an interview here, today, Sir Donald Mann said it occurs to him that the opening of the Panama Canal will exert a more profound and far-reaching effect on the development of Western Canada than is generally realized. That a large traffic will flow westward through the gateway to the coast cities is certain. Vancouver will be the port of import for very considerable portions of the business which will be encouraged by the transcontinental Railway which will be in position to handle the enormous quantities of export grain to Vancouver and other points on the Coast. I see no reason why the surplus of the wheat crop of all the Pacific River District and at least one quarter of Saskatchewan should not seek an outlet via Pacific and Panama Canal.

BARRED HINDU WOMEN.

VANCOUVER, B. C., January 22—Another test of Canadian immigration laws in reference to admission of Hindu women was begun last night when J. H. MacGill, head of Immigration Affairs for Vancouver, refused admission to two women and their children, passengers on the Canadian Pacific Railway liner Montangle, wives of two Vancouver Hindus, Bah Singh, secretary of the Guru Nanak Mining & Trust Company, and Balwant Singh, priest of the Sikh Temple in this city. Fully 700 Hindu residents in Vancouver and neighboring towns assembled near the Canadian Pacific wharf as the Montangle berthed at China docks when it became known that there were Hindu women on board.
