Pacts With Stalin Nearly Worthless

Two former premiers of Russian satellite countries came out this week with additional testimony on the theme that you can't do business with Stalin.

They are Stanislaw Mikolajczyk in "The Rape of Poland," published by Whiteley House, and Ference Nagy in "The Struggle Behind The Iron Curtain," published by MacMillan.

They make it doubly clear that while the Western Powers may want to "keep the record straight" to demonstrate their own integrity by positive efforts to negoti- ate a settlement with the Communists, no agreement with the Kremlin is worth any more than the word of men who are educated to the belief that to break a promise for "the cause" is to earn a reward in the Leninist heaven.

Both former Premiers are now in exile. Mikolajczyk fled for his instrument against his young son. Both were pre-war leaders of democratic movements. Both represented majority peasant parties (overthrown by Communists) strong-arm methods.

Mikolajczyk is bitter over Anglo-American appeasement of Russia which he says extended as far back as 1941, even when the German armies still threatened Moscow. He was prevented, he says, from telling the world the story of Russian imperialism before it was too late.

Nagy, too, talks much of the Allied abandonment of democracy in Hungary, and of Russia's complete domination of the Allied Control Commission before the peace treaty.

Britain and the United States have long since learned the error of their ways in these respects. Nagy's pitiful story of believing he could work with the Communists for the benefit of Hungary, and later his hope that he could absorb some of the shock before its full weight struck his country, is a greater lesson now for Italy and France than for Britain and the United States.

From it a country threatened by the fifth column can learn to guard against Communist meth- ods. Nagy tells how they subvert a labor union; of their methods of usury, Mikolajczyk and Nagy both give vivid descriptions of how to steal an election; how to get the interior (police) portfolio in a coalition government; how to export and "liquidate" your opposi- tion. Nagy even tells how whole- sale rape can be turned into an instrument for subverting gov- ernment. How the Communists in Hungary were perfectly willing to stir up anti-semitism for their own purposes of these men had seen the inside of prisons, long before Yalta, because of their interest in the welfare of their fellow men. Both tried to compromise, to accept hard facts, to co-operate with Russia without being completely swallowed up. They learned their lessons along with the dead Masaryk and Benes of Czechoslovakia,
