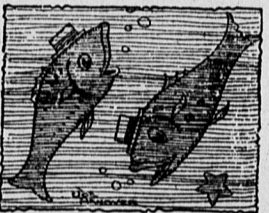

Mr. Castle smiled feebly at her eagerness. Her face was radiant again. Her eyes shone as brightly as if she had never gazed into the mysteries of a green room.

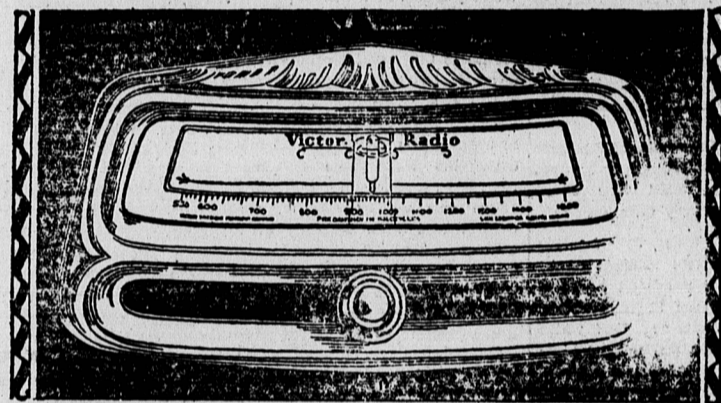

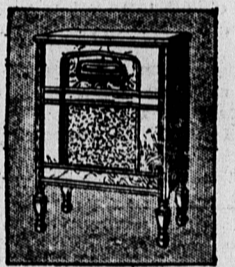
