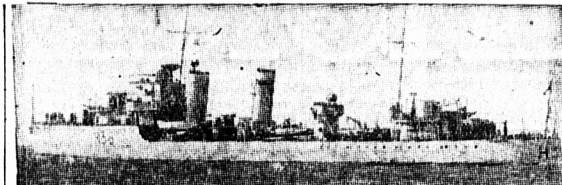

Fraser, lost in evacuation operations at Bordeaux. She will carry 145 officers and men and her armament consists of four 4.7-inch guns, six smaller guns and eight 21-inch torpedo tubes.
