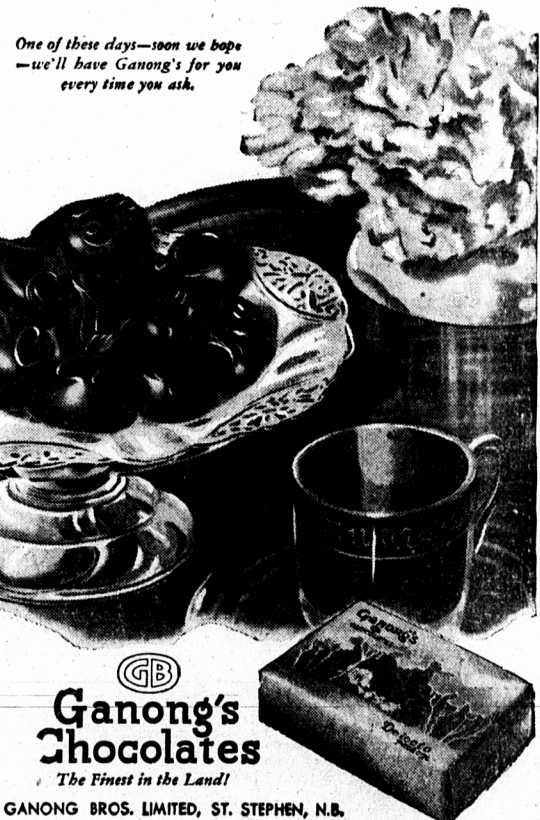

Fur Importations

"Last year the United States imported over \$300,000,000 worth silver fox and mutation fox. A fur, and this did not include about \$100,000,000 worth of furs were imported from Soviet Russia; and while the bulk of these furs went to the United States, a great many millions of dollars worth seeped into Canada.

Burdensome Fur Taxes

"With further reference to the secrecy concerning this budget I may say that a month before it was brought down I was told of what now appears to have been good authority that furs and fur farming were to receive a real walloping.
