A LEUTENANT of the Sydney fire department, has secured a patent for Canada and the United States, of a very unique fire alarm box. The box is large enough to contain a man, and this is where its uniqueness lies. The box is invariably open, but before an alarm can be sent in the person giving the alarm must go inside the box, pull the door after him and lock it. In locking the door the alarm apparatus is exposed. The person cannot be released save by a member of the fire department who is provided with a key. Under this system the ringing in of false alarms will be effectually checked.

THE members of the Maple Leaf Institute held a meeting in Summerville recently for the purpose of securing spring seeds and hay. The Secretary P. J. D. Edmonds took orders last fall for two hundred and thirty tons of government hay. He had the pleasure of distributing nine and one half tons, and it is presumed he will have a busy spring distributing the balance. The next Institute meeting will be held Friday, April 7th at 4 o'clock for the purpose of selecting a man from whom to purchase the seeds. Quotations from several seed merchants will be read, orders received by the Secretary and matters of much importance discussed.

ALBERRY PLAINS AND SUMMERVILLE.—Great was the pleasure prevailed, when word arrived that the winter boats were again on the move, but unfortunately just as the last of the long delayed mail arrived and the people here were expecting to receive it almost daily, they were entirely deprived of any at all for over a week. Surely it is not possible that it is fast in an iceberg between Charlottetown and Summerville during a week of the mild weather. There are deep thoughts on the matter but the mystery cannot be solved. Teams loaded with hay and merchandise are travelling from Montague Bridge to Vernon River, and yet strange but true to write, no mail from Charlottetown to Alberty Plains or Summerville. Some say it is the fault of the road over-seers, failing to keep the road passable, others say it is the fault of the mail drivers. Whether over-seers or mail drivers are responsible for the delay, it is not a matter to be trifled with. Some over-seers maintain if they over-see a track made with horse and sleigh over snow banks eight or ten feet deep by the aid of a man lifting on each sleigh-shaft, in order to lighten the horse, they are doing all that is compulsory. The water is left to drain off without making any attempt to drain it, although horse and driver would endanger their lives in crossing it, when probably two or three men would drain it in fifteen minutes. It is hoped that such over-seers would be furnished with a Public Winter Road Act of the present time, in which he would find that he is compelled to have snow shovelled where too deep for public road, also dammed up water drained off. If such has been done of late all the blame is entirely laid on the mail drivers as no mail has been received since the twenty-fifth of March and this the fourth of April. And if the present Winter Road Act, by following it closely, will not keep the roads passable, it would be well and much to the interest of the public that the House reconsider the act, and make some amendments.
