Potatoes are selling at 25 cents per bushel in this City. White oats at 45 to 46 cents, black at 46 to 48 per bushel and hay at 45 to 55 cts. per cwt.

Rev. F. X. Morrison, who has spent some weeks with his brother Rev. Dr. Morrison, V. G., at Vernon River, leaves this morning returning to San Francisco.

There was a large attendance last night at the joint political meeting at Vernon River. Leading members of the local Government and of the Opposition were present.

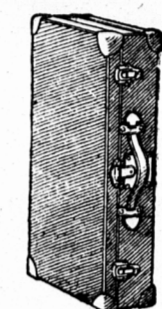
