ON the afternoon of Monday, Sept. 15th, the Horse Show will be seen. This great event will be under the auspices of the Halifax Riding Club, and will be patterned after the Horse Shows of the big Canadian and American Cities.

BOAT races are to be held on the harbor on Monday, the 15th, inst. There will be a class for lobster boats and another for small boats under twenty feet. The course will probably be changed going up west river instead of east river.

D tails from the 82nd Regiment and the Field Hospital Corps left yesterday morning for Sussex to make camp arrangements for those who leave to-day. Quartermaster Sergt Sidney Grey and a corporal and two privates from No 1. Co was the detail from the 82nd Regt and Sergt Major J. S. Walker and Privates McKie and McLean from the Hospital Corps.

THERE was a very large congregation present at St. Joseph's Church, Morell, Sunday, to attend the ceremony of blessing the bell recently purchased for the church. The ceremony was performed by his Lordship Bishop McDonald. The celebrant of Mass was the Rev. M. J. Cole of Halifax, and a lengthy and eloquent sermon was preached by Rev. A. A. Sinton. The bell procured is a magnificent one weighing upwards of fourteen hundred lbs. and it cost in the vicinity of six hundred dollars.

WHILE dredging in the Hillsboro in connection with the bridge construction on Saturday the scoop brought up portions of an old vessel which had apparently lain beneath thirty feet of water from time immemorial. Among other things a small wooden box was brought to the surface which when opened was found to contain two tightly corked bottles of Jamaica rum, such as used to make men hilarious in the days of our grandfathers. The Guardian learns that it was promptly sampled by the flinders who alleged that it had mellowed and improved with age. This opinion may have been expressed in the enthusiasm of the moment. If there was a prospect of any more buried treasures of this sort at the harbor bottom the thirsty corner loafers of Charlottetown would be tumbling over each other to get a job on the dredge.

Five prisoners were in the dock at the Police Court yesterday when the Spindler entered the Court room: William Power was the first called for using profane and lewd language. He was fined \$10 or 30 days and for being drunk and disorderly was given \$20 or sixty days. Patrick Prunty a well-known character at the station for drunkenness and loafing on the corners was given \$20 or 60 days. Joseph Conway drunk and incapable was sentenced to \$4 or 15 days. The last case was a somewhat complicated one. Alfred Callaghan had George Brown who has recently been released from Dorchester after serving a seven year sentence, up for assault occasioning actual bodily harm. He was given three months with hard labor. Annie Carroll a widow was also in the dock on complaint of Callaghan for interfering in the fight and being drunk and disorderly. She was sentenced to \$5 or 30 days. The whole batch of prisoners went down to Hotel Hamilton to serve their terms.
