PRESENTATION.—Mrs. (Rev.) H. E. Thomas, St. John, formerly of Charlottetown, was recently presented by the pupils of her Sunday School class with a handsome bag and purse.

HIGH WIND.—The wind storm on Saturday, which greatly increased during the evening, was keenly felt by those who were forced to go out on business or pleasure. At nine o'clock the velocity of the wind was thirty-six miles an hour, with the temperature gradually falling. Many trees throughout the city were partly broken and otherwise injured.

ANOTHER FOX VENTURE.—They are soon to have a fox farm in the vicinity of Pictou, says a Sydney exchange. Tom Hudson is the promoter of the company which will be capitalized at twenty-six thousand dollars. He has secured September options on two pairs of pups from Messrs. Gordon and Oulton, well known fox ranchers of P. E. Island.

SYBIL REACHES PORT.—The steamer Lady Sybil arrived Jan. 1st, says a Halifax exchange, from Pictou with general freight. On her run down to Pictou from the Magdalen Islands, which was the last of the season, the Lady Sybil had to contend with a stiff blizzard and her decks were kept well awash with combers. NOW RECOVERING.—Word has been received that Jack Carter, son of Ed Carter, who is studying for the priesthood at Rome, and who was hurt recently in an automobile accident, escaped with slight injuries, and will soon be alright again. His companion, a young man named Rooney, of Prince Edward Island, who it was at first feared would succumb to his injuries, is somewhat improved, and expected to completely recover in course of time.

FOX DELAYED.—It will be remembered that a black fox purchased in New York by William Bell and others of Cape Traverse some weeks ago was delayed at Truro, it is alleged, thru some fault of the Express Company. Mr. Bell was obliged to return to Truro to hunt up the valuable animal. He succeeded in locating and bringing him home but it is understood he holds the express company responsible and will make a claim for damages, the fox not being in a satisfactory condition when discovered.

SPORTING NEWS.—Dan McDonald, the Cape Breton middleweight wrestler, says a St. John exchange, has arrived from Boston, where he has been taking part in wrestling bouts during the last few weeks. He will go to Houlton (Me.) Friday morning, where he expects to get on two matches. McDonald said last night that he had not done much boxing during the last two years but he believed that he was still able to make a good showing. He would be willing to meet Mike (Twin) Sullivan in a ten round contest and believes that the bout would draw well either in Houlton or Sydney. He expects to be back in St. John within a few days and would like to hear from anyone who wishes to arrange a wrestling or boxing exhibition with him.
