**Government's Full  
Strength Required  
In India**

LONDON, Nov. 30.—Reuter's  
Delhi correspondent cables that  
Loring, Viceroy and Governor-  
General of India, replying to a com-  
mercial deputation which waited  
upon him, said that recent events  
had rendered imperative the exer-  
cise of the Government's full  
strength for the purpose of main-  
taining the law and preserving or-  
der. He promised the fullest pro-  
tection to all law-abiding citizens.

**Canada's Catch  
Of Sea Fish**

OTTAWA, Nov. 30.—  
Canada's catch of sea  
fish during October was consider-  
ably greater in weight and higher  
in value than October of the pre-  
vious year. Last month the catch  
totalled 489,696 cwts., with a va-  
lue when landed of \$1,466,124; in  
October it was 431,724 cwts., with  
a value of \$1,348,017. This is for  
sea fish landed on both the Atlan-  
tic and Pacific coasts.

The total catch of cod, haddock,  
hake and pollock during October  
was 127,939 cwts., compared with  
133,189 cwts. in October, 1920.

The sardine catch in the Bay  
of Fundy in October was 40,806  
cwts., compared with 37,889 cwts.,  
during the same period last year.

During the fall lobster season,  
which closed on October 15, there  
were 24,023 cwts. taken compared  
with 28,719 cwts. during the fall  
season in 1920. Since the opening  
of the lobster fishing season last  
November a total of 338,182 cwts.  
have been taken and 125,611 cases  
packed. During the same period  
last year a total of 374,173 cwts.  
were taken and 156,775 cases pack-  
ed.

On the British Columbia coast,  
reports the Department of Marine  
and Fisheries, the weather condi-  
tions were not very favourable to  
fishing, especially during the latter  
part of the month. There were 20-  
360 cwts. of halibut taken during  
October, compared with 17,477  
cwts. in October last year. Of the  
former quantity 16,204 cwts. were  
landed by American fishing ves-  
sels.

Salmon landed during October  
totalled the 118,576 cwts., compar-  
ed with 71,755 cwts. landed in Oc-  
tober, 1920. The total catch this  
year so far is 704,497 cwts., against  
a catch of 1,100,969 cwts. during  
the same period last year.
