and Answers Price Control Questions

Questions and Answers on Price Control will appear in The Guardian as a regular feature each day. The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board members—persons who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee.

Q. If I slaughter for my own use, as a farmer do I have to report this to the Wartime Prices and Trade Board?

A. If you are a farmer and slaughter for your own use, you must register as a primary producer with our local ration board. You are required to send in "MI" coupons to your ration board for meat that you consume, at the rate of 4 pounds per coupon. Farmers who slaughter meat need not turn in at the end of the month more than half the value meat coupons in the ration books of their household.

Q. We have lived in a house for five years. The roof leaks but the landlord won't pay the cost of repairs is there any way we can force him to do so?

A. This is a matter outside the jurisdiction of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board. Q. How much does a license and permit to start a business cost? Business licenses and permits issued by the Wartime Prices and Trade Board are free.

MARMALADE PUDDING

1 1/2 lb. suet, 1/2 cup sugar, 2 eggs, 1 1/2 cups orange marmalade, 1/2 cup bread crumbs, 1/2 cup milk, 1 ts. baking powder, 1/2 ts. salt.
Chop suet as finely as you can. If your butter can't give you extra suet, an shortening may be used. Cream suet with sugar. This may be difficult unless you have the suet not melted. Beat yolks light and blend with suet and sugar mixture. Add vanilla and marmalade. Combine crumbs and milk and beat till smooth. Add baking powder, and salt. Combine the two mixtures, fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites. Cover and steam 2 1/2 hours. This recipe should be halved for a small family, but you could make

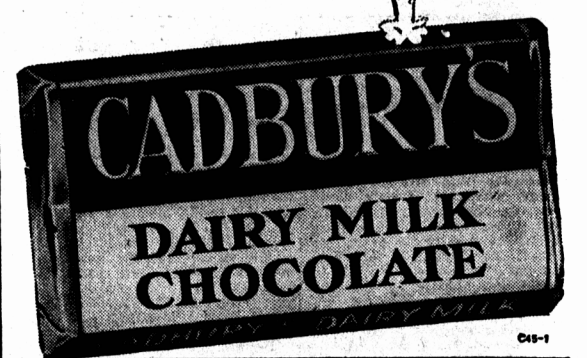

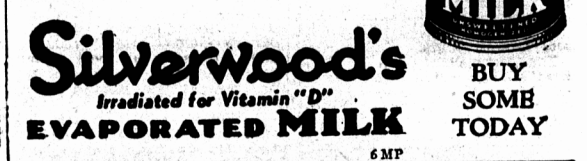

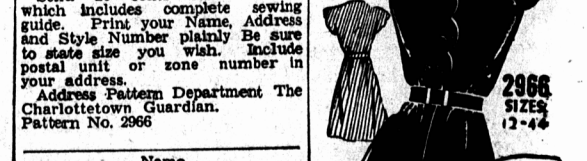
