SERVICES WELL ATTENDED—The Forty Hours Devotion opened in St. Dunstons Cathedral yesterday morning at 9 o'clock with a solemn High Mass of Exposition, celebrated by Rev. Theodore Gallant, assisted by Rev. Jas. Rooney as Deacon and Rev. F. J. Mullyally, Sub-Deacon. Rev. Maurice McDonald acted as master of ceremonies. The altar boys, under the direction of Rev. R. St. John chanted the Pange Lingua during the procession of the Blessed Sacrament.

POTATOES HELD—Holding on March 1 of potatoes in the five States producing 70 per cent. of the United States crop totalled 90,946,000 bushels or 38 per cent. of the production of these States, according to a bulletin issued by the United States Department of Agriculture bureau, Maine, New York, Pennsylvania, Michigan Wisconsin, Minnesota, the Dakotas, Nebraska, Colorado, Idaho, Washington, Oregon and California are the States covered by the report. Of the total 1921 crop in this territory, estimated at 240,987,000 bushels, the surplus over farm requirements is placed at 62 per cent., of 150,306,000 bushels. Of this surplus 119,374,000 bushels had been moved from the farms March 1 and 30,935,000 bushels remained available for shipment. Of the Maine crop of 37,152,000 bushels of which 57 per cent., or 21,176,000 bushels, remained after deducting farm needs, 17,083,500 bushels had been moved up to March 17, the bureau announced. Aroostook County had available to move on present grading 7,865 cars of 700 bushels March 1 and the rest of Maine 625 cars.—Copied from Boston Exchange.

Pope Pius Receives Winsiege Archbishop

First Canadian to Greet Newly Elected Pontiff. (From the Winnipeg Evening Bulletin.) Rev. Father Morton, of St. Mary's cathedral parish, has just received a very interesting letter from Archbishop Stanislo, who is at present in Rome. In this communication, which is addressed from the Canadian College, Rome, and is dated Feb. 13, his grace writes: "The day after the election of the new Pope had an audience of five minutes with him, but no business to bother him at that particular time, but I was very anxious to be the first Canadian bishop to greet him, and I desired to lay at his feet the expression of our devotion and homage. I was never so happy as I am now in the first benediction that was given to Canada, and it was a special blessing for the faithful of Winnipeg, and for the clergy and religious who are working in the diocese. Needless to say I was immensely pleased. This week, or early next week, I shall have an official audience, but nothing can ever equal the emotion I felt in the few intimate cordial minutes when I saw him for the first time. "We have a great pope—one who combines the fatherliness and goodness of Pius X, and the erudition of Leo XIII—May he long live to guide the doctrine of the church. I cannot say more of him than to say that he is a true servant of the Master and that he will draw all hearts to him in the great work he has in hand.

At Coronation.

"Yesterday I assisted at the coronation. You can imagine St. Peter's with the vast throng within and without the Basilica. I never saw such enthusiasm as yesterday. Pius XI was acclaimed with all the fervor that a Roman crowd can display on such an occasion. When the tiara was placed on his head the people went wild with enthusiasm. The pope gave his blessing for the second time from the loggia without and the acclamations were repeated by the throng that filled the huge piazza. The ceremony of coronation lasted from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. and was attended by the solemnity which you so well know. It was worth the trip to Rome just to be present at it. I shall never forget it." Speaking at the cathedral in connection with the devoted devotion on Wednesday evening Rev. Father Handley read this communication to the vast congregation. (Please copy.)
