The funeral services will be held in St. Mark's Anglican Church at Rustico, at eleven o'clock this Thursday morning and burial will take place in cemetery of that Church. For many years and with his last illness Mr. Nelson was Superintendent of St. Mark's Sunday School in which he took a great interest.

Famous Actress and Her Debts

(By Dominion News Service.) LONDON, Oct. 19.—Miss Marie Dressler, the famous American comedienne, who has returned to this country after an absence of fourteen years, intends to remain until she has paid every penny of her debts. She has deposited £1,000 with the Actors' Association as a guarantee of good faith. Miss Dressler is appearing at the Alhambra. The story of her last appearance, or, rather, her failure to appear, in "Philopoean," at the Aldwych Theatres, in March 1909, was told by a member of her old cast. "Our contracts were for twelve weeks," he said to a Press representative, "We received our salaries for the first week. One night, about the middle of the second week, we were waiting for the curtain to rise when it was discovered that Marie Dressler was not in the theatre. "A messenger was sent to her house. The audience became restive. After about three-quarters of an hour, which seemed like a lifetime, the messenger returned to say that Miss Dressler and her husband, Mr. Dalton, had sailed for America that morning. More than forty-five actors and actresses were left stranded. Miss Dressler, who is at the City Hotel, said: "Although I

When asked how it was she knew nothing of those obligations, Miss Dressler replied, "When I realised that Philopoean was a hopeless failure I became a nervous wreck and broke down completely. MINING OPERATIONS INCREASE IN BRAZIL

IO DE JANEIRO, Oct. 23.—Mining operations are steadily increasing in development every year in Brazil, chiefly in the state of Minas Geraes, which is one of the richest regions of the world in gold, iron ore, manganese and diamonds. In 1920 Brazilian exports of mineral products amounted to 277,044,130 kilograms. Diamonds to the value of about \$1,000,000 were exported during the course of the year. The gold and silver output does not figure in the mineral export statistics for the past few years, as the entire production of the mines has been taken under contract by the federal govern-

WOMEN FORM JURY

VANCOUVER, Oct. 24.—Women, for the first time in the history of British Columbia's jurisprudence, and perhaps in that of the administration of law in Canada, were empanelled in a jury here recently. Previous attempts to inaugurate women in Vancouver juries, since the duty or privilege was accorded them by statute, proved to be unsuccessful. A woman was included in the jury at the last assizes in Golden; but none, until this time, have been called to try a civil case. The plaintiff, Mrs. Alice Talbot, a widow, claims \$5,000 damages from the British Columbia Electric Railway for injuries sustained on Oct. 2, last year, when alighting from a street car. The company denies negligence.

OIL FIELDS IN ARGENTINE

BUENOS AIRES, Oct. 23.—The direction-general of oil fields of Argentina has announced that forty-seven new oil wells will be drilled in the Comodoro Rivadavia field this year and 75 new borings will be made next year. It is planned by 1927 to have 650 producing wells on the field, turning out 2,000,000 cubic meters of oil annually.
