ARCANUM SUSPENDS PROTESTING MEMBER

WILMINGTON, N. C., Nov. 2.—Official notice was received here today of the suspension of Cornelius Harnett Council No. 231, Royal Arcanum, by the Supreme Regent of the order in the U. S., because of a recent circular letter promulgated by the local council protesting against the advance in insurance rates upon the order. The local council has over 150 members, some of whom have been policyholders for 25 years. The insurance in force and vitiated by the Supreme Regent amounts to over \$300,000. An appeal has been made for the withdrawal of this suspension.
