MARRIAGE LAWS REPEAL LEAVES YOUTHS FREE TO WRECK LIVES

California Couples Need Not Wait Three Days After Getting License Before Knot Is Tied

California has repealed its hasty marriage law and couples need no longer wait three days before marriage license applications are granted as a regular feature each day. The questions are those which have roused the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board Readers. Persons who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board.

Q. When will the No. 3 ration books be issued?
A. Present plans are to issue the new books during the week of August 23. Full information will be given before that time.

Q. I want to get some tea and coffee to my son who is with the R. C. A. F. in England. Is there any ruling against this?
A. No. It is quite all right to do this, provided, of course, that the supplies come out of your own ration.

Q. As the proprietor of a fur farm, do I need to hold a Wartime Prices and Trade Board license?
A. Not unless you purchase animal skins, or other goods for resale.

THE COOK'S CORNER

JAM-APPLE PIE

Pie paste.
2 cups diced apple (about 13-inch slice)
1 cup good-flavored thick jam (such as dandelion plum)
1 to 2 teaspoons lemon juice
1 tablespoon granulated sugar

Line an 8 1/2-inch pie-plate with rolled-out pie-paste.

Combine apple, jam and lemon juice (you will know according to your family's tastes, just the amount of lemon juice to put in.) Turn filling into the paste-lined pie-pan; sprinkle with the sugar. Dampen rim and cover pie with rolled-out pie-paste which has been slit for escape of steam. Seal, trim, and crimp.

Bake in a hot oven, 450 degrees for 12 minutes (to set paste); lower heat to moderately hot, 375 degrees, and bake pie about 35 minutes longer (to complete baking of the crust and until the apples are tender.)
