HOPES FOR EARLY OPENING OF NAVIGATION.

It usually happens that the winter they are clothed and turn their bows steamers are taken away from this toward Charlottetown.

The ice is not very heavy and it is weakening. It is here rather than at Georgetown that traffic principally and the tributary country round about.

Now at almost the middle of March the conditions are very different. The days are almost as long as the nights; the weather, which has not been very severe during the winter months, is daily growing milder, and the spring is coming our way with inevitable certainty.

This sending the entire trade of the Province round by way of the eastern end of the Island, with the loss of time and added freight charges is no doubt a necessity of the midwinter months, and so long as it is necessary it is cheerfully submitted to.

Premier Hazard's bill to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors under heavy penalties, gives great satisfaction to the friends of prohibition and is in accordance with the general desire of the House and the country to impose all possible restrictions upon the liquor traffic.

MILITARY TRAINING IN OUR SCHOOLS.

Sir.—There has been a good deal written lately in our public press as to the advisability of having physical and military training introduced into our schools, and I think that these articles are worth the careful perusal of every father and mother in this Province.

I think that those having the honor to hold a Commission in the Canadian Militia should ventiliate their ideas on this subject, and give the public their opinion on this most important and perhaps many-sided question. I therefore take the liberty of placing before the public what I conceive to be the advantages of this training.

In the first place I will state what course in my humble opinion this training should take. I believe that physical drill should be done by all children both male and female until they have reached the age of 13 or 14. If this was done we would have fewer round shouldered young men and women in our midst than we have today, their bodies would be stronger, and their general health would be greatly improved.

Another important point is that our Regiments of Militia would not be compelled each year to begin the annual training with about 50 per cent new and un drilled men, thus necessitating from year to year a great deal of repetition in the elementary part of a soldier's training.

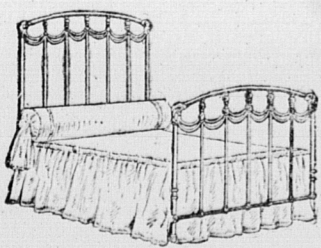
