## CREAM EXPORTS TO UNITED STATES

(From Consul Frank Deedmeier, Charlottetown, Canada, U. S. Consular and Trade Reports.)

The first shipments of cream from Prince Edward Island to the United States were made this fall. Prices are 32 cents per quart, f. o. b. Charlottetown, quality 50 per cent butter fat. The freight is 3 cents a gallon from Charlottetown to Boston by the Plant Line steamers. The shipments are to large distributors at Boston who have made arrangements for regular consignments.

Prince Edward Island has about 50,000 milch cows, excellent pasturage, and there were produced last year in this Province 2,507,853 pounds of cheese and 466,507 pounds of butter. Until this fall all the milk of this Island not required for home consumption has been taken by the local creameries. Under the prices now offered for export cream, the production of cheese and butter will be materially curtailed. Cold-storage facilities are now provided in Charlottetown, to which the cream intended for export is sent, and shipments are made from this point as the market in Boston requires.

### SECLAR SCHOOLS FOR PORTUGAL.

LISBON, Oct. 24.—The secularization of the schools involves the rejection of religious instructions therein by systematic teaching of individual morality. This is strongly favored by the reformers heading the government, who claim that the greatest peril to the young republic would be passed, if they succeeded in educating the children so that they would apply the same honesty to politics as to private life. It has been decided to suppress the faculty of theology at the University of Coimbra and abolish the taking of oath by students and professors. The Portuguese embassy to the Vatican has been reduced to a legation.

### SENSATION IN CHAMBER OF DEPUTIES.

PARIS, Oct. 26.—On the reassembling of the Chamber of Deputies, after the Government had been attacked by the Socialists, Premier Briand created a sensation by declaring that he had proof, through the confessions of the leaders of a recent railroad strike, that there was deliberate plot to ruin France by violence, anarchy and civil war.

### BALLOONISTS HEARD FROM.

CHICAGO, Oct. 27.—Thoroughly fatigued, and showing plentiful marks of an arduous week of struggling through the dense wilderness of Northern Canada, Messrs Hawley and Post, the intrepid aviators who sailed the America II, nearly 2000 miles farther than any other contestants in the big balloon race for the Gordon-Bonnet cup, arrived here last evening.

### WHITE SLAVE LAW VIOLATED.

PITTSBURG, Pa., Oct. 26.—Frank C. Williams and Anna Hull, of this city, were found guilty of violating the white slave law, enacted by Congress on June 27th last, today. Williams was sentenced to two years and six months in the federal prison at Leavenworth, Kas., while Miss Hull will serve a like term in the western penitentiary here.

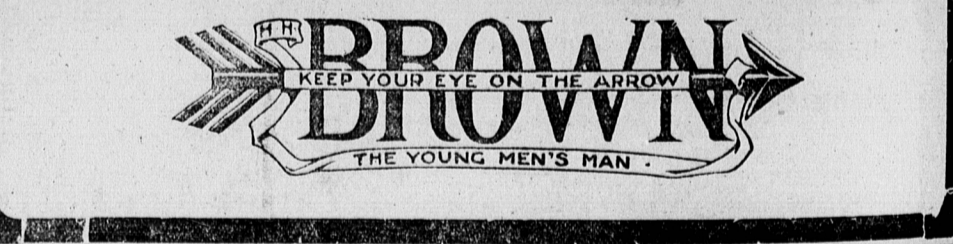
