The St. John Board of Trade has completed arrangements for Excursion Railway and Steamboat Fares during the third week in August, which it is proposed to make "Merchants' Week." Tickets will be issued on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, August 14th, 15th and 16th, by the Canadian Pacific Railway, the Dominion Atlantic Railway, the Shore Line Railway, the Star Line Steamers, and other lines to be arranged for from all points on their lines to St. John. Negotiations in connection with the Intercolonial and Prince Edward Island Railways are in progress, and the arrangements made can be ascertained from the ticket agents at points of departure. Return tickets at one fare will be issued by the Dominion Atlantic Railway. Elsewhere purchasers of one way first-class tickets to St. John on the above dates will please apply at starting points for a standard certificate. This certificate must be presented to and countersigned by the Secretary of the Board of Trade at St. John. On presentation of the countersigned certificate at any date up to 22nd of August inclusive to the ticket Agents of the various lines to St. John, a ticket for the return journey will be issued without charge. During August Stocks in all lines will be at their best, and the Wholesale Merchants will have all arrangements completed for the convenience of their customers. The Annual meeting of the Board of Trade of the Maritime Provinces will open at the St. John Board of Trade Rooms on Wednesday, August 16th, at 8 p.m. Subject of great Commercial importance to the Maritime Provinces will be considered. This meeting will no doubt form an additional attraction to visitors. The members of the St. John Board of Trade trust that Merchants from outside the City will avail themselves very generally of this opportunity to visit St. John.

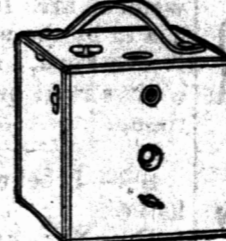
