### THE DOCTORS AND THE LIQUOR TRAFFIC.

The medical profession is a high and noble calling, and in every age has had in its ranks men of elevated character and possessed of the best skill and wisdom of their time. How much the world owes to the intelligent effort and scientific skill that have in these later days provided the sanitary measures which have shut out or controlled in all civilized lands the plague, the cholera, the smallpox and other sweeping epidemics which in earlier ages swept millions to untimely death. In devising means for the prevention and cure of human ills, for the relief of suffering, bringing rest where there is weariness, soothing where there is pain, how great and widespread has been the ministry of mercy which the profession has conferred upon our race! And the long line of professors of the healing art has in every age been illustrated by examples of courage and self-sacrifice as high as any upon record in human annals. Few persons even in our own time but can recall instances within his own knowledge in which some noble physician has perilled or sacrificed his life in the effort to save others from death. From early days the moral standards

of the profession have been high. We read this lofty devotion to the best welfare of mankind in the oath of Hippocrates, prescribed to his students in those long-past days before the apostolic fishermen plied their calling on the Sea of Galilee, or Caesar led his legions into Egypt:

"... I will prescribe such medicines as may be best suited to the case of my patients, according to the best of my knowledge; and no temptation shall ever induce me to administer poison. I will religiously maintain the purity of my character and the honor of my art. Into whatever house I enter, I will enter with the sole view of relieving the sick, and conduct myself with propriety towards all the members of the family. If during my attendance I happen to hear of anything that should not be revealed, I will keep it a profound secret. If I observe this oath, may I have success in this life, and may I obtain general esteem after it; if I break it may the contrary be my lot."

Let us not wonder that some physicians have not kept to this high standard. Every calling in life, even the highest, has been snatched by unworthy members. Human nature is frail and doctors are but human. And we believe the medical profession as a body has had perhaps as few disreputable members in proportion to its numbers as any other. Its general standard is high and the great majority of physicians are properly jealous of its integrity and honor, as they ought to be. It is because of our belief that such is the case that we make this appeal to the medical practitioners of this City and Province against a practice that has invaded the profession, greatly to its detriment and involving a loss of that public respect and regard which have hitherto existed. We refer to the prevalent practice of prescribing liquor under the guise of medicine, but really pandering to a depraved taste for intoxicants. Some names have been mentioned in court in this connection, and hundreds have read them with surprise and regret. But there is only too much evidence that those named are not the only or perhaps the worst offenders.

Let us admit that a doctor may be placed under great temptation and pressure to give a prescription for whiskey. In hundreds of cases these applications are refused. The pressure increases whenever it becomes known that he will yield to it. Every doctor who for a trifling fee, or no fee at all, issues this form of prescription for assumed or imaginary ailments, or for mere alcoholic thirst, soon becomes known to the thirsty ones and to the general public. The form of many of these prescriptions is sufficient evidence of their dishonest character. Others are not dated as to place or time. Others specify no quantity. Others bear the name but not the title of the prescribing doctor. Not a few are written in pencil, and thus are liable to erasure and change. The publication of facts in our possession in regard to these prescriptions would make very unpleasant reading for some practitioners in and about Charlottetown. But this is not our object. Our object is to prevent the repetition of these transactions, which are painfully realised by a number of our best doctors as degrading to the medical profession. We trust that some at least who have already acted imprudently or thoughtlessly in this matter will realise the gravity of the issue and recall and return to the high standard of conduct which ought to always characterise the legitimate practice of medicine.

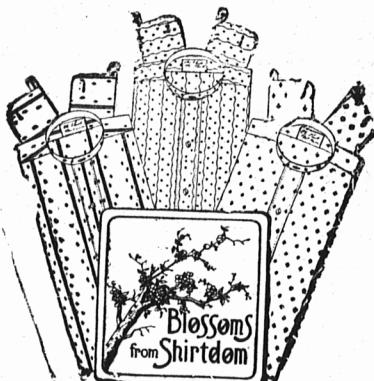
