THE OFFICE OF GOVERNOR.

The time has come to choose a Lieutenant Governor for this fair Island. The choice is one which requires judgment and discrimination, and will appear upon a moment's reflection. For the Lieutenant Governor is the official head of the Province. He must be appointed by the Governor General in Council by instrument under the great seal of Canada. He holds office during the pleasure of the Governor General, but is not removable within five years except for cause assigned. Before assuming the duties of his office he is required to make and subscribe before the Governor General or some person appointed by him the oaths of allegiance and of office. When so appointed and sworn he is for five years granted a salary of \$7,000 a year, a much higher rate of pay than any other official within the bounds of the Province. All of which conditions and incidents certainly imply that the office is one of importance, and so it is.

Some thoughtless persons may have assumed that the duties of a governor are few and of a merely formal character such as might be performed by any person of ordinary intelligence. Such a person might ask, what does the Governor do besides opening and proroguing the Legislature, assenting to a few Acts, living in Government House and drawing his salary? These are among the things he does, but they are not all. In the first place he is the representative of the King in his Province, an important connecting link in the great chain of authority extending from the Sovereign to the subject. Without him the Executive Council is powerless to pass an effective order or to make the smallest appointment. Without him the Legislature

cannot meet, or having met cannot enact a law. Except as authorized by his message the Legislature cannot authorize the expenditure of a dollar of the public money. Without his assent no Act of the Legislature, having met cannot terminate its session. Nor can it be dissolved, or a new general election, or a single by-election be held without his imprimatur.

Of course we shall be told that the Governor only acts by and with the advice of his Council; that they are the real power and he only a figure-head. Persons who so speak or think are not well versed in the constitution of the country. The Lieutenant Governor is vested with very important powers and prerogatives of his own apart from his Council. In the first place he is charged with important functions at the formation of a Government and at every subsequent change therein. If the Government of the day is at any time defeated or resigns he may call upon whom he will to form a new Administration. Thus he really names the Premier. He may, and usually does call upon the leader of the Opposition, but he is not bound to do so. He is not even limited to the Legislature in his choice. He has power to call upon whom he will. And if the person so called accepts the responsibility, then every man whom he calls to his Cabinet is in like manner subject to the approval of the Governor. He may reject any one who in his judgment is unsuitable. He may even dismiss his entire Government, as has been done more than once in Canada. Of course in exercising any of these greater powers and prerogatives he takes the risk that his action may not be approved by the people, in which case he may himself be removed by the Governor General in Council, for cause. But the power undoubtedly exists.

Nor is the matter of assenting to the Acts passed by the Legislature so simple and devoid of responsibility as it may seem to many. His Honor is in duty bound to peruse every Act with careful scrutiny before assenting thereto in the King's name. The most harmless appearing Act may contain a clause which exceeds the power of the Legislature to enact. It may trench upon a field reserved exclusively to the Parliament of Canada. It may be opposed to an unrevoked Act of this Legislature, or to an authoritative Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, or of the Parliament of Great Britain, or it may be found to be contrary to sound public policy. In which cases it would be the duty of the Governor to withhold his assent, or reserve the Act for the consideration of His Majesty's pleasure. If by any possibility the Legislature were to pass an immoral Act, as for instance legalizing public gambling, it would be His Honor's duty to refuse his assent and it could not become law. All of which goes to show that the assent of the Governor to an Act of the Legislature is by no means a mere formality. It is a duty that requires knowledge, skill and judgment as prerequisites for its rightful exercise.

Sound judgment a thorough knowledge of the constitution and a diplomatic temperament are always important in any high office of the state and in few places are these more necessary than in the office of Lieutenant Governor. It is a mistake to suppose that any man who may choose to put himself in nomination for the office of Governor is fitted for the position or can creditably fill it. We have so far spoken only of the official side of the question. There is another side, of almost equal consequence—the social side. Government House ought to stand at the head of our entire social system, with an influence at once refining and elevating and fitted to set the standard for social observance throughout the Province. It ought not to be exclusive, for this is a democratic country. It might fittingly be expected to afford entertainment of some state and ceremony to distinguished visitors, whether of the Royal Family, or those in high official
