Corn was sharply higher with wheat at opening. Rain over the Holidays and tomorrow is predicted. We have heard of but one report of firing which comes from Western Missouri. Looks as though shorts were pretty well in, although advance is well maintained.

Oats about two cents up in sympathy with Corn and weather report which is the lowest condition ever known. Large trade with heavy buying for Country account.

Provisions—There has been a big broad market with good buying influenced by strength in Coarse Grain, but the advance was met by selling for profits and by packers.
