Besides a sadly bereaved husband and infant daughter, she leaves to mourn a sorrowing father and mother, John R. and Mrs. McDonald, Vernon River, together with two brothers, Andrew at home and Leo in Moosemin, Sask., and three sisters, Mary T. teacher, at Morell, Celia of Stanley Bros, and Mildred at home.
