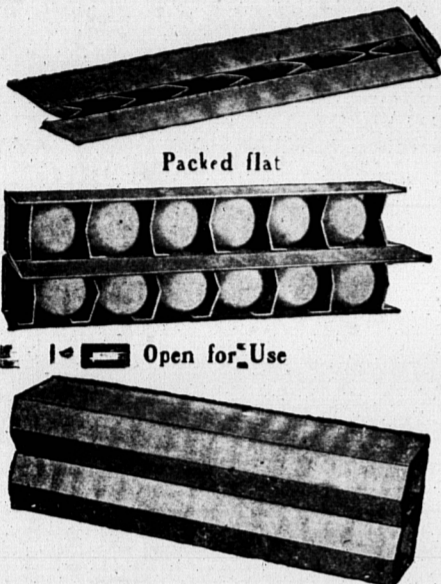

LESSON III. JULY 16.

MANASSEH'S WICKEDNESS AND
PENITENCE.

2 Chron. 33:—1-13.

GOLDEN TEXT.

"Cease to do evil; learn to do well."
—Isa. 1: 16, 17.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS

There are sons and heirs of their fathers who go about to improve upon what has been left to them in ways that are very strange. It has to be taken for granted that their purpose is to improve upon their inheritance, or one has to charge them with incapacity or wickedness. It looks as though Manasseh started out with the idea of being "smart," "clever," "liberal," "tolerant," but he learned by and by that he had been foolish, vain, disobedient, wicked.

It is a sight which saddens the heart when it is seen that the conduct of a son is undoing the good work which his father had been seeking to accomplish. A fortune being squandered, a splendid name being dishonored, noble principles being abandoned—the sight of it is pitiful. It is pitiful. It is painful. Alas, that sons are ever guilty.

One of the things that psychology may be able to explain, if it takes sufficient account of the fact that the humane heart is deceitfully above all things, is the process of men to imitate the weak things, in others rather than the strong, the reprehensible rather than the commendable, the bad rather than the good. Why did Manasseh copy and follow the abominations of the heathen?

It may be well to consider some modern parallels to those pagan altars which the young king built in the house of the Lord. The man who is worshipping the dollar all the week will very likely have his altar to mammon present with him at church. Some congregations are cursed by the altars of fashion, and social status, and wealth, to which they have given place.

Manasseh went the whole length of provoking, defiant, sacrilegious abominations as if endeavoring to crowd Jehovah from His throne. It was not his failure in wickedness that the Lord God did not abdicate. But the defiance of the king did not take account of the fact that the name of Jehovah was under covenant to be in Jerusalem forever. Sinners are always failing to take God and His pledge to His people into the reckoning. God is, and He is the Rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. But what about those who do not seek Him? Well, what?

Verse twelve answers the question so far as the case of Manasseh is concerned. He was taught in affliction. But is it not to be had that men have to wait for such an eye-opener to good sense and right reason and devout endeavor as affliction? Only that God in His amazing mercy takes men at their best, only that He seizes upon their purest and most reverent moods and lifts their faces towards His own when they are most humble, only that He sees the prodigal while he is yet a great way off and runs to meet and welcome him—only because these things are so is it true also that men come to repentance and the song of salvation. It was mercy which revealed God to Manasseh and through mercy he knew Him.

Be satisfied to worship where God is pleased to place His name. No other altars can enrich that sanctuary.

History, after all is said, is kind. The extended lesson text both in this chapter and in the Book of Kings tells us that a full account of the King's repentance, and restoration to the favor of Jehovah had been chronicled. Nevertheless, kind as that history is, how many lines had to be inserted to tell of the things that ought never to have been! It is well to remember that we are daily writing for eternity.
