In Memoriam

MRS. F. C. HARRIS. BRIDGETOWN, N. S., Aug. 8.—The death took place here yesterday at her home, one of Bridge-town's oldest, best known and most highly regarded residents, when Mrs. Frederick Church Harris, passed away after an illness of several months duration, at the age of 91. Mrs. Harris was formerly Miss Mary Aldous and was a daughter of the late Hon. John Aldous of London, England, who came to Canada in 1841 as Commissioner of Crown Lands at Charlottetown, P. E. I., at which place the deceased was born. In her twentieth year she was married to F. C. Harris who predeceased her a number of years ago. Excepting for a few years spent in England, she spent the early part of her married life, Mrs. Harris has made her residence in Bridge-town to which place her parents, later removed, and where the late Mr. Harris was engaged in business. Possessing a keen interest in people and events which befell her, she was well known and admired to a rare degree with social charm, she had the happy gift of making friends and while most of her contemporaries have passed on, she is well missed by a host of friends who will remember her as a charming lady of the old school, who leaves the town the poorer for her passing. She is survived by a brother Montague Aldous, Land Commissioner for the Hudson's Bay Territory, and by a number of nieces and cousins in England, Canada and the United States. Mrs. Fred Beckett of this town, who has been devotedly cared for by the deceased, throughout her illness, is a niece. Funeral services will take place in St. James Anglican Church, Saturday afternoon, conducted by Canon Underwood and interment will be in the family plot in the Church of England Cemetery.

FOX FIGURES

CHARLOTTETOWN.—(CP)—Production and mortality tables for the Prince Edward Island Department of Agriculture show that 294 ranches visited had 7,739 female, and 3,998 male foxes. These ranches produced 20,593 pups, 698 of which died at birth, 235 from one to six weeks old, and 369 from six weeks up.
