The eastern express arrived in Charlottetown Saturday at 9:30 a.m. on time; the southern express at 9:35 a.m., ten minutes late, and the Cape Traverse accommodation at 9:55 a.m., on time.

The members of Alpha Institute, York, at their regular meeting completed arrangements for their exhibition to be held in conjunction with the Executive Institute Exhibition on the 20th inst in York Hall. The S. S. City of Sydney, of the Black Diamond line arrived in port at daylight this morning from Montreal. After discharging cargo she will proceed to St. John's, Nfld.

The present trip of the Sydney was one of the stormiest encountered this season. She was delayed two days and a half near Quebec, having to lay to both above and below the city on account of a big ice sheet and snow storm which swept the river the last part of last week. For days the snow and rain continued to fall, the decks and rigging becoming coated with ice, six inches of snow fell on her decks. The City of Sydney has a big general cargo, and a few passengers. After one more trip, she will lay up for the winter.—Sydney Post.

The following item from a Halifax exchange will be of interest in Charlottetown, as the cargo, the schooner New Home referred to was insured in companies representing by Edmund T. Higgs, Marine Underwriter, of this city. There was no insurance on the vessel. The schooner New Home, which went ashore on Thrum Cap shoals, at the entrance to Halifax Harbor, Thursday morning, has become a total loss, and, further, has disappeared from sight. The New Home, a Shelburne-owned craft of 31 tons register, and belonging to Raymond Wilson, of Doctor's Cove, was bound from Prince Edward Island to this port with a cargo of farm produce. Her owner was master, and he with a crew of two men, got safely to shore, Thursday, by the time dark settled down, the New Home had lost her spars, and when morning broke today she had totally disappeared from view. She either was broken completely up or went adrift.
