The North Shore of New Brunswick appears to be suffering from prolonged drouth, Terrible forest fires are raging on the southern bank of the Miramichi, having started near Barnaby River Station. Some dwellings and farm stock were destroyed on Saturday and Sunday. The fire had travelled 15 miles on Sunday last and several settlements were threatened. One of the greatest forest fires in history swept the Miramichi country in the year 1835.

The statement had been given out somewhat ostentatiously from Washington that in the year 1900 the Philippines had increased their imports of iron and steel from the United States by 351 per cent. The New York World shows that percentages are often misleading, the actual increase in value being only \$106,345. During the same time the Philippine imports of iron and steel from Britain had increased \$477,604 and from Germany \$168,645. "Whence it appears," says the World, "that our British and German cousins are both outting us out in the iron and steel business in our dearly bought Asiatic possessions."

The Duchess of Albany, to whom it was recently reported that Lord Rosebery was engaged, is the widow of Prince Leopold and sister-in-law to King Edward. The report has received a partial contradiction but it has been for some years expected that Lord Rosebery would marry a member of the Royal Family. Different royal personages have been from time to time indicated as his probable consort. He is a peer of the United Kingdom as well as of Scotland, is Knight of the Garter, has good looks, health and wealth and might properly look to an alliance in the highest circles.

Murdock McKinnon vs A. F. Bruce, a rule nisi was granted returnable on Thursday next to show cause why the petition should not be taken off the file. On motion of Mr. D. A. McKinnon K. C. the Grand Jury are considering the case against Flora McKinnon for setting fire to a barn.

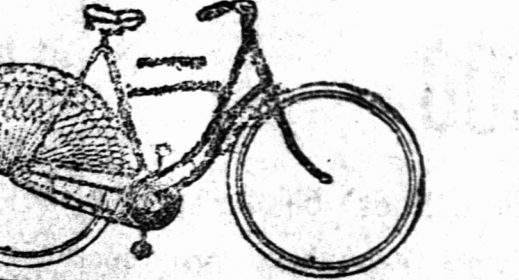
