EASTERN NOTES.—The peculiar weather we are experiencing, thaws, sleet and warmth in February, warrant us in coming to the conclusion that we haven't got the usual body of ice in the Gulf this winter. Rain with north, northwest and northeast winds is something seldom seen here in winter, but has been seen recently which would be a natural impossibility were the usual body of drift ice packed to the north of us.

Enthusiasts sitting by good warm fires talk learnedly about the winter navigation of the Gulf with suitable steamers; such a scheme might be carried out with some measure of success this winter in all probability, but with the majority of our winters, and the usual condition of our Gulf at that season, the attempt is sure to end in failure as disastrous as that which overtook the Gaspeia in her maiden winter voyage.—Not much is transpiring outside the usual routine in country districts here at present. A pie social, a party or entertainment, sometimes in one section, sometimes in another sometimes got up by one circle, sometimes by another, lends variety to country life, breaks the monotony of our long winter evenings, and brings people of the different communities together, sometimes to know and to appreciate each other the better. Though no such laudatory reports of entertainments may be published from here as from some other sections, we have the talents, the experience and the executive ability necessary for conducting them properly, but, by the way, does not the voluminous reports of these gatherings from the different parts of the Island, occupy relatively too much space in our principal journals to day. Yes! Like obituary poetry, I know it is hard for the editor to refuse insertion for fear of offending supporters; like obituary poetry, these laudatory reports may be written with the best of intentions, but their increasing number, and increasing length, as each writer endeavors to use bigger adjectives and longer words, and more descriptive phrases than his predecessor, brings us near a time when they must be curtailed in number and volume. When anything eatable accompanies these gatherings, the impression is endeavored to be conveyed, that it was better and richer and more palatable than anything that ever was got up before in the world's history, and you are sure to be met with the stereotyped expression that the tables were "literally groaning beneath the load of good things provided by the beautiful, accomplished and charming ladies presiding at the never to be forgotten occasion.—George McDonald has returned from Sydney after a short visit. 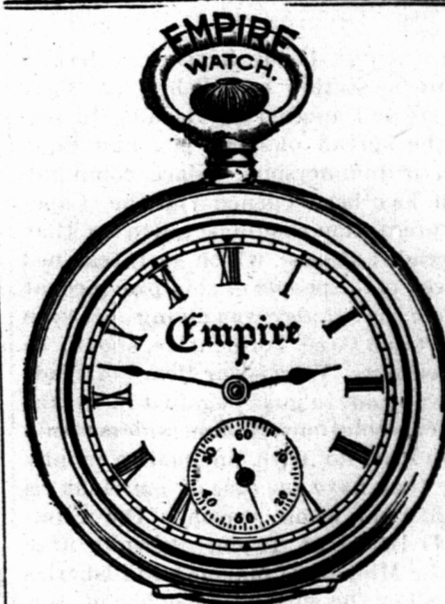
