Fixed German Payments for 1922

PARIS, March 24.—A partial moratorium has been given German for her reparations payments in 1922, according to a decision of the Reparations Commission made public here today. The plan carries with it a specific obligation on the part of Germany to raise sixty billion marks, in addition to the usual balance, to satisfy the claims of the Allies.

Germany's Payments

The Commission calls for the execution of the German agreement providing for the payment of 200,000,000 gold marks and of 1,450,000,000 marks in goods during 1922. As Germany has paid about 282,000,000 gold marks in ten payments, there remains a balance of 438,000,000 gold marks due.

Decision Angered Germans

BERLIN, March 24.—The decision of the Reparations Commission on Germany's request for a moratorium, with the details of the payments to be made and the quantities to be given, were printed in the afternoon papers here today. The decision fell like a bombshell in the official quarters in Wilhelmstrasse, and in the Reichstag created anger and dismay.

Merchants' Bank Officials Summoned to Court

MONTREAL, March 24.—Sir H. Montagu Allen, last President of the defunct Merchants Bank and D. C. MacArow, former General Manager of the same institution today were summoned to appear in court for complaints laid against them by the department of Justice and the Minister of Finance jointly, in connection with the financial statement made by the Bank to the Receiver General, covering the month of October 1921. The charge against Sir Montagu is that he signed approved and concurred in the report which allegedly contained false and deceptive statements, regarding the Bank's financial position. The charge against Mr. MacArow which includes that he signed Sir Montagu's name to the report.

U. S. Expecting Full Payment

Propose Bond Issue by Russian Soviets

LONDON, March 24.—The Russian Soviet Government should issue bonds covering the whole of its indebtedness, it is understood to have been in a proposal at the first session of the Allied technical experts' meeting here today, to prepare a program for the Geneva Conference. Bonds covering all of Russia's national debts, but also municipal and individual loans to the old and new Russian regimes, are understood to have been included in the proposal. The bonds would be exempt from interest for five years.

Withdrawal of Jap Troops from Siberia Held Up

TOKIO, March 24.—The Japanese withdrawal from Siberia has narrowed down to a single issue, the Nikolai settlement, says a correspondent learns from reliable sources. Troop will be speedily withdrawn from all parts of Siberia, save the Nikolai district, regardless of such a settlement. The Tokyo Government prefers to negotiate on Nikolai with a responsible anti-Russian Government. It is possible, however, the troops will be waiting for a settlement.
