LONDON, June 23.—It is reported here that President Wilson has received a vast amount of information showing the activities of Franz von Rintelen and other German agents in promoting trouble between the United States and Mexico.

Fear Safety Of American Troops

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 24.—Without reports at hand that nearly the entire American cavalry command of about 100 soldiers may have been annihilated in the fight at Carrizal, Wednesday, grave fears were expressed in official circles to-day that not even diplomatic reports from Mexico City can prevent open hostilities between the United States and Mexico.
