TORONTO, July 1—(CP)—George MacKinnon Wright, writer, scholar and often termed "dean of Canadian historians," died here today.
Prof. Wright, retired from active life as professor emeritus of history at the University of Toronto, cele- brated his 88th birthday only last Friday. He had been in ill health for some time.

Research Costs
OTTAWA, July 1—(CP)—Eight Provinces spent a total of \$5,034,000 last year on research and science, the Government said tonight. About one-half was for conservation and development of natural resources.
A report issued jointly by the Reconstruction Department and the National Research Council said the total does not include provincial grants to universities and other research agencies outside provincial jurisdiction.
Totals in 1947 for the Maritime Provinces with 1946 figures in brackets:
Prince Edward Island, \$35,000 (\$32,000); Nova Scotia, \$267,000 (\$133,000); New Brunswick, \$179,600 (\$191,000).
The 1947 per capita figures, with 1946 comparisons in brackets:
Prince Edward Island, 37 cents (\$36); Nova Scotia, 43 (29); New Brunswick, 36 (19).
