ALLIES THREATEN THREE JAP AIRFIELDS

Victory Loan Total Ahead Of Last Drive

The victory loan total in this province last night, after two days of campaigning, was reported as \$24,100,000. Officials connected with the campaign were pleased with the showing. Without going into details one of them said it was "quite a bit" in excess of the total for the first two days in the fifth loan campaign. The objective now, as set in the plan, is to reach \$30,000,000.

SOMEWHERE IN ENGLAND, April 25—(CP Cable)—The King has inspected thousands more Canadian second-line troops—his second pre-invasion visit to Canadian troops this spring. He now has seen all the Canadian army troops in England who will be going into Europe when D-day comes.

LONDON, April 25—(CP)—Britain's invasion year budget, calling for expenditures of \$2,877,000,000 (about \$36,915,000,000) was presented to the House of Commons today by Sir John Anderson, chancellor of the exchequer, who proposed taxation produce slightly more than he had announced.

KINGSTON, Ont., April 25—(CP)—Most Rev. Joseph Anthony O'Sullivan, bishop of Charlottetown, was installed as Roman Catholic Archbishop of Kingston at a colorful ceremony in St. Mary's cathedral here tonight. His predecessor, Most Rev. M. J. O'Brien who died last Aug. 31, 1921, was appointed archbishop here earlier today, when he was born at Hamilton, Ont., Nov. 29, 1868 and was educated at St. Mary's school and St. Jerome's College, Kitchener, Ont. On completing his classical course he went to Grand Seminary, Montreal, and was ordained a priest in 1901.

With the abortive Japanese invasion of India checkmated, Admiral Lord Louis Mountbatten's southern Asia command may be preparing for a quick counter stroke into northern Burma before the monsoon rains.

LONDON, April 25—(AP)—A pre-invasion fleet of more than 1,000 United States bombers and fighters today hurled hundreds of tons of explosives on three airfields in southwest Germany and channeled communications on the 11th day of an unprecedented Allied sky assault which has rocked Axis Europe from the Atlantic coast to the Black Sea.

ADVANCED HEADQUARTERS New Guinea, April 26 (Wednesday)—(AP)—Against negligible Japanese opposition, strong American forces swung closer the jaws of pincers on Hollandia's three airfields while planes from the Dutch New Guinea skies, a spokesman disclosed today.

Linked together, these reports imply that an Allied shift from the defensive to the offensive in the Assam-Burma sector may be impending. There is every reason to expect a Japanese retreat from India before the monsoon rains start. A fast and powerful Allied follow-up to join, beyond the Chindwin River, with 14th Army elements threatening enemy rear holdings the Rhams "block" on the communications and air borne troops holding the Rhams "block" on the northern Burma.

At 11 p.m. tonight the German radio warned that Allied planes again were approaching which meant the attacks were continuing the 12th consecutive day.

By support of the invasion, planes from southwest and south Pacific bases struck blows at enemy air bases.
