IMPROVEMENTS.—It is understood that the members of the First Methodist Church, Charlottetown, are talking over a proposition to have a new and up-to-date front placed on the building, at a cost of \$15,000 or \$20,000 and the interior re-seated.

Mr. Crossman is locating a shop in the central part of the city, where he will attend to his orders. Further notice will be given in a few days.

DIED YESTERDAY.—The death occurred in Charlottetown yesterday morning after an illness of about six weeks of Geo. Rowe in the 67th year of his age. He leaves to mourn, besides a widow, one son and one daughter Miss Patience M. and W. M. both of this city. The funeral will take place tomorrow afternoon at 2.30 from his late residence, corner of Prince and Water Streets, to the People's Cemetery. Rev. J. Heaney will officiate.

HIGHLY HONORED.—By an overwhelming vote of the congregation, the Rev. Dr. Gordon, pastor of the First Baptist Church, was requested last night to withdraw his resignation, which he had tendered consequent on his being offered the chair of practical theology at Brandon. The feeling which actuated the small number who voted against his withdrawing his resignation was that the church was much honored by its pastor being selected, and that, looked at from that point of view, its interests would be best served by his acceptance. Dr. Gordon is considering the matter, but, though he has given no decision, it is expected he will go to Brandon, says a Montreal exchange.—Dr. Gordon has a wide circle of friends in Charlottetown.
