Note In Potato Bag Brings Reply

Mr. Tilman Arsenault of Summerside, worked as a longshoreman loading ships with potatoes for Britain this spring and he attached a note to one of the bags. This week he received the following reply:

Sickop, Kent, June 14, 1947. Dear Mr. Arsenault: I own a grocery business in Kent and was rather pleased to find in one of the sacks of potatoes imported from Canada, a note on a grower's tag which might lead to a personal contact.

Firstly, may I answer your question regarding the condition of the "spuds". There is only one answer, they were really first class and this is the general opinion of the actual eaters, not from the sellers point of view.

You see on arrival in this country the potatoes are unloaded at the docks, delivered to the wholesaler, who in turn, delivers them to the shopkeeper (that is like myself) and he sells them to the general public and they tell me that your potatoes are the best they have had for a very long time, in fact it had not been for the shortage, I could have sold them by the bag without weighing them into 4 lb lots. Generally things are not too bad in the old country—we have no end of restrictions with lots of "does and don'ts" and whilst we cannot live as we did before the war, we manage to rub along on our rations. I shall be very pleased to hear from you, when, if you wish, I will write to you further on the conditions of life here both personally and in general. Perhaps some newspapers would interest you. Awaiting your reply with interest.
