Clergy Endorse Red Cross Campaign

Sunday in the churches throughout the province announcement was made of the Red Cross Campaign. The national headquarters and local Red Cross Division requested the clergymen of all denominations to call the attention of their congregations to the fact that the campaign is to be launched on Wednesday. The service rendered to humanity by the society in the prevention of disease and the building up of health among the people of our country was commended and an appeal made for the generous support of this good work.

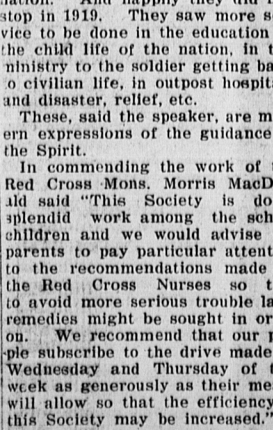
At St. Paul's Church Rev. H. D. Raymond preaching on the message of Whitsuntide—the outpouring of the Holy Spirit—drew attention to the fact that the witness to the gift was found in the power of languages which was conferred on the Apostles. People ask, said he, why the Church has not the power now. The reply is to be found in the circulation of the printed Gospel in more than 700 languages. But that was only one expression of the gift. In every age since as the need has expressed itself there has been a corresponding gift of the Spirit. It began with the ministry of our Lord to the child, to the sick and infirm. It has expressed itself in every ministry of love all down through the ages. In the days of the Crimean War Florence Nightingale's work revolutionizing the very discipline of the British Army and saving lives by thousands was clearly an expression of the gift.

We know what happened in the last Great War when Red Cross organized the womanhood of the world in service which saved the nation. And happily they did not stop in 1919. They saw more service to be done in the education of the child life of the nation, in the ministry to the soldier getting back to civilian life, in outpost hospitals and disaster relief, etc.

These, said the speaker, are modern expressions of the guidance of the Spirit.

In commending the work of the Red Cross Mons. Morris MacDonald said "This Society is doing splendid work among the school children and we would advise the parents to pay particular attention to the recommendations made by the Red Cross Nurses so that to avoid more serious trouble later remedies might be sought in order on. We recommend that our people subscribe to the drive made on Wednesday and Thursday of this week as generously as their means will allow so that the efficiency of this Society may be increased."
