Recent Air Station Contracts Awarded To Summerside Firm

OTTAWA, Oct. 28 (Special) - Prince Edward Islanders have repeatedly complained on the floor of the House of Commons and on the public platform that the province gets less than its share of defence contracts. Today, however, according to a list of Defence Production Department contracts from October 1 to 15, the Province has been awarded a contract unique since establishment of the department two years ago. It is for a leanto, presumably at the R. C. A. F. Station at Summerside, and the contract is awarded to M. F. Schurman Company Limited of Summerside, for \$17,993.

Ottawa people, including delegates to the meetings of the National Liberal Federation now in progress at the Chateau Laurier hotel here, are mystified by the contract. "What?" queried P. J. Philip, Ottawa correspondent for the New York Times. "Do they mean it costs \$17,993 to build a leanto in Prince Edward Island? I could build a very good small house in Ottawa for less than that."

Ottawa officials were not quite certain what the leanto leans against and why it is being built. They said however that M. F. Schurman Company at Summerside would know all the technical details. (Schurman Company officials at Summerside said the leanto was to be used for office space at the Summerside Airport. At present there is a one-storey shed along the sides of a hangar. Now it is proposed to make the shed two stories).

Other Contracts

Two other large contracts have been awarded this month to the Schurman Company. They are construction of a sewage treatment plant at Summerside Air Station for \$216,890 and replacement of sub-floors in buildings to the amount of \$134,043.

No other contracts on the list issued today went to P. E. I. firms. However, the list includes an amount of \$30,720 for stockings, presumably for women's branches of the armed forces, \$12,731 for additional neckties, \$11,096 for paper napkins, \$41,789 for dish-cloths, and \$20,115 for nylon table cloth for an unnamed purpose.

Crapaud Anglican Church Observes Anniversaries

A special service was held in St. John's Anglican Church, Crapaud, on Wednesday evening, October 22nd, commemorating the 50th anniversary of the building of the present fine church. It was also the 102nd anniversary of the founding of the parish.

Rev. J. T. Ibbott, St. Paul's Church, Charlottetown was the preacher and delivered a powerful message dealing with the labors of the pioneer churchman in the face of many obstacles and pleading for loyalty and efficient service on the part of all the parishioners of today.

During a period in the service the new rector was handed the keys of the church and also those of St. Elizabeth's Church, of which he is also rector.

The service was attended by an exceptionally large congregation and the hymns, responses, etc. were sung and intoned by a full choir of St. Mary's Church, Summerside. Mr. Everett Penwarden presided at the console.

All the clergy of the Deanery of Prince Edward Island were present at the service.

After the induction, a supper was held in the adjoining church centre at which a decorated birthday cake was cut in honor of the 50th anniversary of the building of the church.

Mme. Therese Casgrain, O. E. E., the C. C. F. provincial leader in the Province of Quebec and only woman leader of a political party in Canada, who concludes a three-day visit to Prince Edward Island this evening at Kensington where she will address a public meeting.

This attractive and charming lady has long been a champion in the cause of women's rights and led the campaign in Quebec Province which finally won the right for women to vote for the first time in that province in 1940.

No stranger to the field of politics, she has, through her father and later through her husband, had close contact with the two other political parties in Canada. Her father, Sir Rodolphe Forget was a Conservative member of Parliament for 13 years. Her husband, the late Pierre Casgrain, at the time of his death only two years ago, was a judge in the Supreme Court of Canada and earlier had been Speaker in the House of Commons where later Secretary of State in MacKenzie King's cabinet.

Four Injured In Highway Accident

A family of four, Mr. and Mrs. Glen Horne and two children, of Summerside, were injured and shaken up yesterday morning when a half-ton truck in which they were travelling, went into the ditch about two miles east of Portage.

Mrs. Horne received the most serious injuries of the four. Her injuries were reported to include a fractured pelvis and other injuries to her back. It was reported that she and one of the children were believed to have been thrown through the windshield, while the other child was tossed out the door.

The children, aged about two and four years, received only slight injuries. Mr. Horne suffered painful injuries to his ankle but was not required to stay in hospital.

The cause of the accident is said to have been a failure in the steering mechanism of the truck.

C. F. has made less spectacular but steady gains since its inception many years ago.
