THE GAME BIRDS AND MR LESLIE

An Interesting Contribution To The Discussion As To Preserving Them

Sir.—In a recent issue of your paper there appeared an interesting letter from Mr. H. A. Leslie, a local sportsman of Kensington, criticising the proposals of the Provincial Game Association's protection of our Game birds, notably geese and brant. Though an honorary member of this Association I am not actively connected with its work, and any criticism I may make of Mr. Leslie's letter does not arise from the fact that I give my moral support to the aims of the Association. Neither is it my desire to defend the Association concerning the matters complained of by Mr. Leslie. It has been already attended to by Mr. Carbone. I desire simply to call attention to some of Mr. Leslie's statements concerning the birds in question as viewed from the standpoint of natural science. I am not a professional sportsman, and when it comes to matters of experience in the shooting of birds, the man who has spent thirty years at it must have acquired some valuable information, but when it comes to a matter of knowledge concerning birds and bird life acquired both by study and experience I am prepared to call in question some of the statements of even so good authority as Mr. Leslie.

First Mr. Leslie tells us that there are two "species" of wild geese of different appearance, size and habits, frequenting our coasts. These he calls the "white-bellied" goose and the "grey goose." Now if there are these two distinct species of geese it is most interesting fact of which natural science has as yet made no record. In different parts of this broad Dominion there are no less than ten different species of wild geese, all quite different; but only one species of the ten is so far credited with frequenting our North Atlantic coasts. This noble bird is the Canada goose (Branta Canadensis) and is the largest and best of all the wild geese family. Moreover, unlike any of the others, it is found in varying numbers in all parts of the country from the Atlantic to the Pacific. The "greater snow goose" winters on the Atlantic coast south of Maryland, but in its migrations northward it takes the overland route direct to Hudson's Bay and westward. It never follows our coast. Rare specimens of the "white fronted goose" are said to have been found on the Atlantic coast in the south, but it belongs distinctly to the Pacific. Where then does Mr. Leslie's species come from? It is quite likely that any small difference in size, coloring or time of flight may be fully accounted for in age, condition, or place of wintering, rather than in differences of species. If there were any two species of geese on our coast the American Museum of Ornithology would be glad to know the facts.

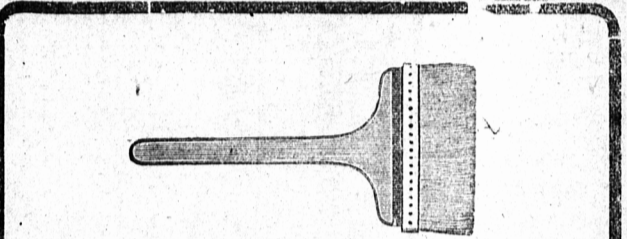

Synopsis of Canadian North-West

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS
ANY even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 9, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or may have over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section 160 acres, more or less.
Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Sub-agent for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may however be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father or mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader. The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following conditions:
(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
(2) A homesteader may, if it so desired, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.
(3) If the father or mother (if the father is deceased) of homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a home stead entered for by him in the vicinity and homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father or mother.
(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowance crossed in the measurement.
(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents and on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.
Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for land.
