A MISCHIEVOUS "PLANK."

One of the reasons why Canadian sympathy went largely with President McKinley and the Republican party in the great national election in the United States was the anti-British plank in the National Democratic platform. It was a deliberate insult to British people everywhere, and was no doubt resented by thousands of Canadians in the Republic who had become naturalized citizens there. And not only was the Anglophobe plank in the Democratic platform, but it was enforced by the principal Democratic orators and "spell-binders" throughout the campaign from Bryan down to the humblest of his followers.

The mischievous plank to which we refer, after insinuating most untruthfully that there was an "ill-concealed Republican alliance with England," went on as follows:

"Believing in the principles of self-government and rejecting as did our forefathers the claims of monarchy, we view with indignation the purpose of England to overwhelm with force the South African republics. Speaking, as we believe, for the entire American nation, except its Republican officeholders, and for all free men everywhere, we extend our sympathies to the heroic burghers in their unequal struggle to maintain their liberty and independence."

It is highly gratifying to loyal Canadians that the electorate of the United States, while deciding other great issues of the campaign, set the seal of their emphatic disapprobation upon the above offensive declaration. Mr. McKinley is quite as truly "American" as any man of either party; he is in no sense of the word pro-British, but he has chosen, while at the head of United States affairs to maintain a dignified friendship with the British government and people. And in this he has truly represented the best American sentiment and the true American interest. The two peoples are akin in race, language, law, literature and religion, and besides, the United Kingdom and the colonies of the Empire furnish a market for more than one half of all the products of the United States that are sold abroad.

The insulting plank in the Democratic platform was a menace to international peace and good-will; it made the possibility of Bryan's election a matter of grave international concern and a grave danger to the material interests of the United States. It is for all these reasons a satisfaction to Canadians and Britons everywhere that the mischievous plank has met with a stern and crushing rebuke from the better elements of the great Republic.

In Montreal on election day the Grand Trunk Railway closed its great workshops at Point St. Charles to enable its employees to cast their ballots. The men were left entirely free in the exercise of their franchise, but the Montreal Witness tells that they were not at all pleased to lose a day's pay on account of the elections. The management of the Grand Trunk were understood to be in sympathy with the Laurier Government, but apparently took no steps to make the influence of that great corporation felt in the contest.

A telegram from Brandon to the Montreal Witness on election day reported that betting was then even in the great contest between Sifton and Macdonald. The fact that Mr. Sifton rolled up a majority of over 700 serves to show how much more people know after an election than before. Brandon and St. John were probably the two hottest contests in the campaign, and in both cases the great influence of the C. P. R. was thrown on the side of the Opposition candidates.

Our big Dominion has many kinds of weather on one day. For instance on election day the weather was fine in the Maritime Provinces, excepting in northeastern New Brunswick; in Quebec and Ontario it was rainy and cold; in Manitoba it was clear and cold, following a light snowfall; on the Pacific coast it was fairly fine and warm.

The Halifax Merchant says:—A good many Ontario oats have been offered in this market at slightly lower prices than are asked for Prince Edward Island.
