Better learn how not to do things from the story of Jacob and Esau than try to cover their faults or minimize their own temptations to self-indulgence, or trickery, or greed. Reverence is natural where there is either a fear or a consciousness of the nearness of God. Whither can you flee from His presence? Therefore, be reverent and offer thy vows. Old grudges are hard to forget or conquer and old fears have haunting powers of resurrection. Such grudges and such fears, however, pass away when the face of God is seen in the face of man because they were begotten of wrongs between man and man.

The dreams of childhood and youth ought not to be discounted or discouraged because of the large place they picture for their future. If one fails to come to the standard of his dreams the disappointment is his; if he attains to the standard of his dreams the chagrin will belong to the one who chided him.

Helpfulness is the proof of quality in character. The kind of help one can offer is according to the measure of his ability. Whether one drives a nail for you or unravels a mystery, it matters not. Your gratitude is due to the willingness of the help you receive rather than to the nature of it.
