WINNIPEG, Nov. 9—(CP)—Wheat futures slumped 1-2-3-8 cent on Winnipeg grain exchange Saturday in sympathy with declines in outside wheat markets. Trading was light with only scattered purchases from mills and New York interests offsetting light offerings. No Canadian wheat or flour export trades could be confirmed. At the close Winnipeg December wheat sold for 73 1-4 cents, May 77 cents and July 78 3-8 cents. Futures of buying failed to push coarse grain futures higher and almost all futures finished lower. Oats were 1-4-1-8 down barley 5-8-3-8 off, flax 2-1 1-4 lower and rye 1 1-8 to unchanged.
