Where Clergy Are Scarce

In the whole of British Columbia and the Yukon Territory there are only 170 clergy. The region is rapidly opening up, and the new railways are bringing in an enormous stream of new settlers which it is far beyond the power of the Church to cope with. This immigration will speedily reach still greater developments, and the various agencies working in England on behalf of the Church on the Pacific Coast have decided, therefore, to federate together, so as to promote at once a greater unity and a greater strength. The British Columbia and Yukon Church Aid Society, in view of the importance of buying land for church sites while it is cheap; for establishing an ecclesiastical training college; and for the promotion of a campaign among Indians and Orientals on the Pacific Coast, states that an income of at least \$275,000 a year will be required for the next fifteen years.
