MONCTON HOPES TO GET CHEAPER INSURANCE RATES.

MONCTON, Oct. 14.—A deputation consisting of Hon. C. W. Robinson, Capt. Masters and F. A. McCully waited on the city council tonight to see what could be done towards inducing the St John board of insurance underwriters to tape off the recent 40 cents increase imposed on Moncton.

The city council replied by passing a resolution to be forwarded to the underwriters setting forth the purchase of a chemical engine to be delivered within sixty days, the installation of thirty hydrants at once, the purchase of 1,000 feet of hose, an additional fire engine, also stating that plans have been drawn for an additional reservoir costing \$200,000 and a new fire station is to be built in the west end of the city. The resolution embodied tests of water made today, showing a pressure of 70 pounds at the pumping station and from 47 to 58 pounds on St George and other streets.

The insurance men considered this would be sufficient assurance to the underwriters that the city would carry out the improvements and thought this action satisfactory.

THE STRIKE FUNDS ARE GONE.

MONTREAL, October 14.—A sensation was caused in labor circles here this evening when it became known that Thomas Izzard, fourth vice-president of the International Union of Bricklayers and Masons, had been arrested charged with appropriating strike pay funds to his own use. It is stated that some forty of the recent strikers became dissatisfied when they did not receive their strike pay. They claimed that their names were on the list and that they should have received their money with the rest and accordingly swore out a warrant for the arrest of Izzard. The latter claimed that there was nothing in the complaint and that he had paid out the money as far as it would go. He was released on bail and left the city this evening. It is reported that he has gone to New York to straighten matters out. Mr Izzard has been in Montreal for the past three or four months and was in charge of the strike of bricklayers and masons, which was settled a few weeks ago.

FREDERICKTON MAN ROBBED IN MONTREAL.

MONTREAL, Oct. 13.—William Bentley, thirty-five years of age, of Fredericton, N. B., was robbed of \$90 and a steamship ticket for Liverpool by hold-up men on Youville Square last night. Bentley had bought his passage to Liverpool as a third class passenger on the Allan liner Victorian, which sails from port tomorrow, and he was on his way to the steamer. When passing through the square he was pounced upon by a gang of roughs, one of whom pointed a revolver to his head while others rifled his pockets, robbing him of his transportation ticket and \$90, leaving only \$2 in his possession.

Information was given to the Allan Company officials and to the police, and one of the company's detectives found a youth offering to sell the ticket on the wharf. It was taken into Allan's office, where he stated that a drunken man had given him the ticket. The lad stoutly denied that he had been concerned in the robbery, and when Bentley came forward he said the boy's statement in this respect was true, for he was not among the crowd that set upon him last night.

Bentley seemed satisfied to recover his steamship ticket, and refused to prosecute the youth who had it in his possession.

TENDERS FOR CANADA'S WARSHIPS DELAYED.

OTTAWA, Oct. 14.—At today's meeting of the cabinet council, Louis Laverge, M. P. for Drummond and Athabaska, and Liberal whip for the province of Quebec since 1901, was appointed to the senate in succession to the late Sir George Drummond. A writ for the by-election has been issued for the common vacancy in Drummond and Athabaska, thus occasioned. Nominations are set for Thursday, Oct. 27, with polling, in case the seat is contested, a week later. As Mr Laverge's majority, however, averages up in the thousands, it is not unlikely that the election of a Liberal successor will go by acclamation.

Judge Horace Harvey, of the supreme court of Alberta, has been promoted to be chief justice of the province in succession to the former chief justice, A. L. Sifton, now premier. W. C. Simmons, of Lethbridge, one of the leading members of the Alberta bar, has been appointed to succeed Justice Harvey as puisne judge of the supreme court.

Hon Mr Brodeur will go to Halifax next week to represent the government at the celebration planned for the reception of H. M. S. Niobe on Oct. 21.

The naval department has been delayed in the calling for tenders for the proposed new Canadian cruisers owing to the fact the admiralty plans for the new ships are not yet available, pending a number of radical improvements in warships of the proposed type on which the British experts are now working, and which will be incorporated in the new Canadian vessels.

It is not known yet just when the plans will be available for inspection by the firms who propose to tender for construction of the new cruisers and destroyers. The delay, however, will result in Canada securing the benefit of the very last word in naval construction.
