Stock Markets At A Glance

WINNIPEG, Dec. 9 — (CP) — Only a small export business was reported in wheat Saturday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange with 200,000 bushels taken by United Kingdom buyers.

SALT LAKE CITY, Dec. 9 — (AP) — Doors of the Salt Lake City Stock Exchange were locked Saturday against eager share-buyers as brokers and bookkeepers strove to catch up with a record-smashing wave of trading. The boom, launched by eastern capital, apparently is based on the hope of an increase in the price of silver, the metal that bulls so many fortunes in the west's earlier days.

NEW YORK, Dec. 9 — (AP) — The Stock Market Saturday completed a generally bullish week by posting another average peak for the last 15 years with gains ranging from fractions to around three points on the largest Saturday volume since May 8, 1929. Amusement, independent motors, scattered rails and utilities monopolized bidding from the start as dividend hopes vied with inflation psychology for attention. Dealings were fast at intervals and speeded up in the final 15 minutes. While extreme advances were trimmed by profit cashing in numerous cases at the close, and a number of losers cropped up, plus signs held the majority by a wide margin.

Britain Needs 34,000 Nurses

By James McCook Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON, Dec. 6 — (C P) — Britain, faced with a new emergency, has a slogan to meet it—"Put the 'sing' in nursing." About 34,000 nurses are needed at once. Aneurin Bevan, health minister, has appealed for more men and women to enter nursing services and has announced a code under which the conditions of those engaged in nursing will be improved.

The code, which the minister said had been approved by hospitals and institutions consulted, means substantial changes. Under it, nurses would not be called on for work which is not an essential part of nursing, and ward sweeping, polishing brass, washing trays and washing up crockery would be left to the orderly or domestic staff. Fittings and equipment which caused unnecessary labor should be eliminated.

Trained staff who so desire should be allowed to live outside the hospital or institution. It is recognized that in hospital work discipline during duty hours is essential, said a health ministry statement. "No unnecessary rules, however, should be maintained, and the reason for necessary regulations should be explained to nurses. In their off-duty hours, nurses should have the same unrestricted use of their leisure as any other member of the community. There should be no unnecessary restrictions on smoking, drinking, wearing muffs or having visitors of either sex. At meal-time nurses should be regarded as being off-duty, and be free of all unnecessary regulations."

Other changes called for: Training on modern standards of nursing education, allowing

students adequate time for study and essential practical work, as well as reasonable recreation and relaxation, with lectures so arranged that off-duty hours and sleep for night nurses are not interfered with. Adequate pensions on retirement. A 96-hour fortnight for hospital nurses. A minimum of one complete off-duty day a week, with arrangements for periodic week-ends leave of absence. Arrangements for late passes for student nurses should be based on modern standards such as are applicable to girls in training colleges for other professions. Four weeks' leave a year with pay, exclusive of sick leave. Three good meals a day besides a mid-morning snack and tea. A well-furnished room for every nurse with libraries, recreation room and guest rooms. A nurses' representative council in each hospital to discuss staff affairs and make recommendations to the matron and through her to the appropriate committee of the hospital governing body.
